

What is August Recess?

Congress returns to their districts in August to hear from their constituents, but very few ever contact their elected officials.

- 85% of Americans believe elected officials don't care what people like them think
- 23% of Americans who voted for a Representative cannot name their current Representative.
- Very few ever contact their elected officials
- 41 million Gen Z, many of whom are people of color, are eligible to vote and that is power.

Here's your opportunity to schedule a meeting with your senator and representatives. You can even do this in community. Start by gathering a couple friends virtually. Listen to and pray together. Consider taking younger folks with you and platform their voices. Here are a few things you can do.

Contact or Call your Representative

- Enter your zip code here to find your representative's phone number
- Call the U.S. Capitol switchboard at (202) 224-3121 & get transferred to your representative.
- Calls can be an effective way to let your representative know how constituents are feeling about a certain issue. The staff tally how many times a call comes through re: a specific issue.
- Call Script:

Here are some legislative asks you can make:

Incarceration

- Reduce or eliminate the costs of communication for incarcerated individuals with their families.
- Revisit laws that contribute to prolonged incarceration, such as the Three Strikes law.
- Halt federal executions that have been scheduled after a decade-long pause.
- Eliminate the use of private prisons.

Immigration

- Aggressively protect and expand DACA and work towards a pathway to citizenship.
- Increase funding for Alternatives to Detention (ATD).
- Ensure children are released with their families from detention centers, not placed into foster care.
- Ensure asylum seekers are genuinely heard and not turned away.

Gaza

- Permanent ceasefire and an immediate return of all hostages.
- Expansion of humanitarian corridors, and an end to Israel's indiscriminate use of force, collective punishment, and the mass transfer of civilians in Gaza.
- Entry of Humanitarian Assistance.
- End of arms sales to Israel.
