Overview of resources	This gives learners an understanding of the Warm Spaces initiative to help people get through winter with rising energy costs and encourages them to engage with the website.

		<p>Slide 2 - list of websites available in the YH area.</p> <p>Vocabulary, reading and listening activities will work with all websites, but some slides will need to be changed according to which site you are using.</p>	
E2+	<p>Slide 3 - Learners can read and listen to the slide, and discuss the questions on Slide 4.</p>	<p>Slides 3 & 4:</p> <p>Put the slide up or text a link to learners' phones.</p> <p>Ask learners to read and listen to the slide, and flag up any words that are new or difficult to understand/ sound different to how they read them.</p> <p>Go through the questions on slide 4 with them as a discussion activity, to raise awareness of the Warm Spaces initiative.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Learners will become aware of the Warm Spaces initiative and how it might benefit them. • Learners will read and hear new vocabulary words in context.

E1+	<p>Slides 5, 6 & 7 - Learners can read and listen to the words on slide 5, then look for them in slide 6, underlining them before matching them to their meanings on slide 7.</p>	<p>All slides are printable - these activities can be done on paper or on learners' phones/ a smartboard. You will need a phone or smartboard with speaker to play the audio files.</p> <p>The matching activity can be done as paper manipulatives if printed out and cut up.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learners will become familiar with new vocabulary - they will read it on the website and match it to the meanings. Learners will hear new words said in a Yorkshire accent and use them/ recognise them in context.
E3+	<p>Slides 8 & 9 - Learners can click through to the warm spaces map on the website, and navigate it to find their nearest Warm Spaces.</p> <p>Learners can listen to the questions or read them, or both, and then use the map/ web page to find out the answers.</p>	<p>It's best if learners can access this map on their mobile phones - if they click through to it they can use their phones individually to answer the questions.</p> <p>You can decide to do this as a listening and speaking exercise, or reading and writing.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Learners can read and listen to questions and use the website and map to answer them, either in speaking or writing.
