

## **MBA Startup Fellows Program 2023**

Two Georgetown McDonough MBA students completed the inaugural 2023 MBA Startup Fellowship, which is designed to support MBA students seeking to launch a new business. Each MBA Startup Fellow received:

- a \$10,000 grant to defray living expenses and startup costs allowing the student to bypass traditional MBA summer internship recruiting
- access to the Georgetown Venture Lab
- weekly mentoring from two mentors
- access to significant entrepreneurial programming over the summer.

The two inaugural fellows are profiled below. (Note: a third fellow was selected, but withdrew from the fellowship when he chose to join an existing startup and take a leave of absence from Georgetown. He cited the fellowship as helpful in allowing him to fully pursue his startup goals, leading to a positive outcome for him.)
