1. Learn about the founder of Girl Scouts - Juliette Gordon Low.

- 1. She was Born Juliette Magill Kinzie Gordon on October 31, 1860, in Savannah, Georgia. Locate Georgia on the map. Is it in the North, South, East or West? How far is it from where you live?
- 2. "Daisy," as she was affectionately known became her childhood nickname.
- 3. She descended from a long line of strong and independent women that were willing to try new things and learn.

2. Learn about the Girl Scout Promise & the Girl Scout Law

- 1. Recite the Girl Scout Law.
- 2. Come up with one example where you can individually or as a troop live out each line.
- 3. Recite the Girl Scout Promise.
- 4. How do you think the Law & Promise are alike? How are they different? Why do you think Juliette came up with these as the ideals she wanted Girl Scouts to possess?

3. Lean about the Girl Scout Hand Sign

- 1. What hand do you use for the hand sign?
- 2. Which fingers are used?
- 3. Find out when the hand sign is used and what it stands for in each situation.

4. Learn one tradition in Girl Scouts (a song, an activity, etc.)

- 1. Learn about how it started and what it's used for. Is it just for fun? Is there a meaning behind it? Does every troop in your area participate in it or is it something that some troops so and some don't?
- 2. Decide as a group whether this is a tradition that you want to have as part of your troop.
