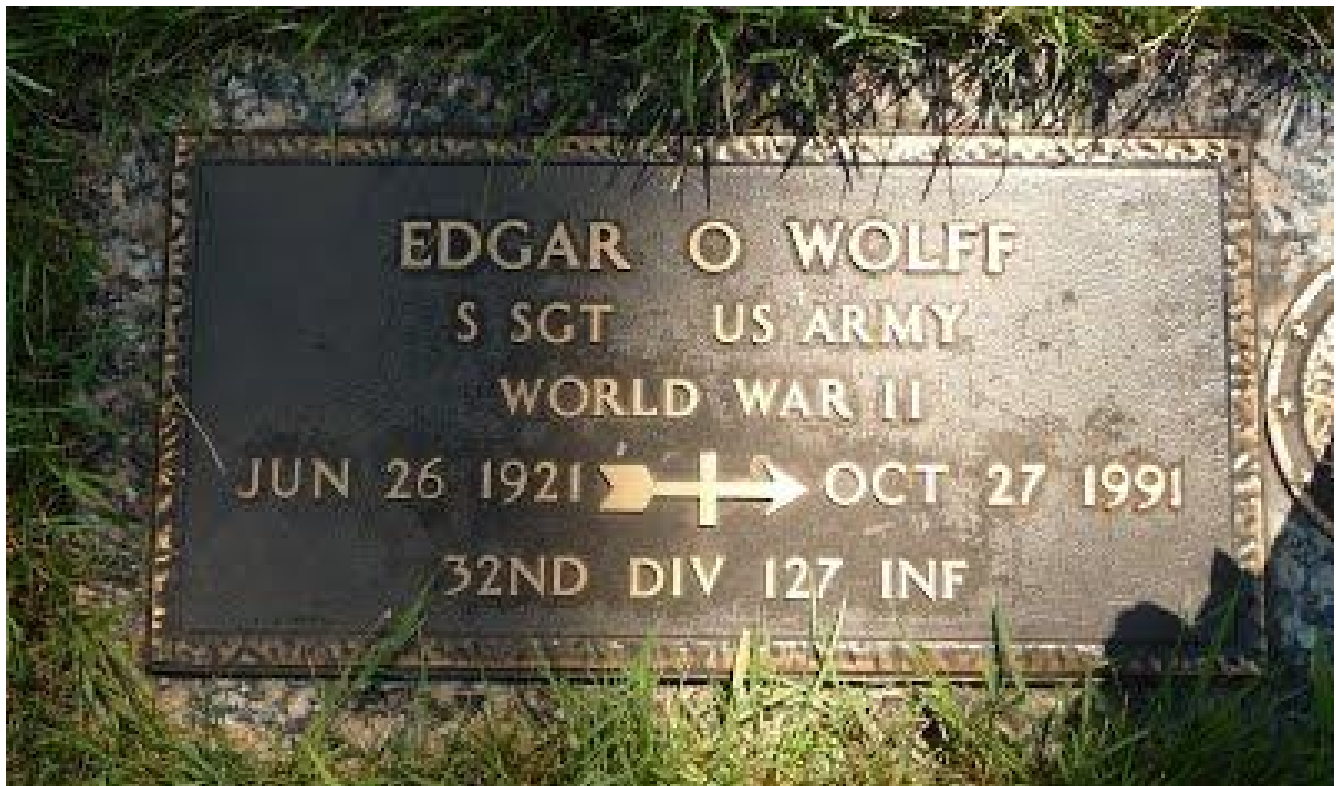


SSG Edgar O. Wolff

MENASHA — Edgar O. Wolff, 70, Menasha, loving husband, father, brother and good friend, passed away unexpectedly on Sunday afternoon, Oct. 27, 1991, at Theda Clark Regional Medical Center.

He was born June 26, 1921, in Oshkosh, the son of Otto and Hattie Wolff. He had been a resident of Menasha since 1956.

He had been employed at Kimberly-Clark Corp. for 35 years, retiring in 1983. He was a member of their Quarter Century Club. He was a member of Winnebago County Chapter of the Red Arrow Club 32nd Division Veterans Association, a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and the 127th Infantry Company H Old Timers Club. He was a member of St. Timothy Lutheran Church, Menasha. He joined the National Guard and served his country during World War II with the U.S. Army 32nd Red Arrow Division from 1940 to 1943. He participated in the Campaign of Buna Sector in New Guinea and received American Defense Asiatic Pacific Campaign Ribbons. He enjoyed life, football, airplanes and classic cars.

He is survived by his wife, Dorothy (Tesch) Wolff, whom he married June 17, 1944, in Oshkosh. He is also survived by his son, Tim (Julie) of Appleton; and one brother, Otto Wolff Jr. of Oshkosh.

He was preceded in death by his parents, a brother, Frederick, and a sister, Ilene Cottingham.

Funeral services will be held at 11 a.m. Wednesday, Oct. 30, 1991, at St. Timothy Lutheran Church, Menasha, with the Rev. James C. Plymire officiating. Burial will be in Lake View Memorial Park, Oshkosh.
