Report Description

Each year the district is required to notify the public of our compliance with Division 22 Assurances. The information contained in this article, the annual report, helps to fulfill the standards for Public Elementary and Secondary Schools as set forth in OAR Chapter 581, Division 22. The Board of Education establishes policies that help to keep our district in compliance with state and federal laws and regulations. The superintendent, with approval from the Board, establishes day-to-day procedures and uses these policies to keep our district running smoothly. This report explains some of the programs and services we provide within our district.

District Improvement Plan OAR 581-022-2250

Each school district in the state of Oregon is required to conduct self-evaluations to develop and/or update their local district continuous improvement plan, every three years. Willamina School Districts' Integrated Plan was submitted in the Spring of 2023. It is a four-year plan. However, a team of educators meets regularly to monitor the plan for success. The development of the Continuous Improvement Plan (CIP) is a collaborative review process that provides the opportunity to fully align the processes that Willamina School District has in place, monitor growth, and foster success for all students.

State Report Card and State Assessments OAR 581-022-2100, 581-022-2110, 581-022-2112, and 2255

Each Fall, the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) releases the annual state report card for each district and individual school, as required by state and federal laws. Assessment results and student

growth, attendance, rate of test participation in state tests, and graduation rate are some of the types of information included in the reports, Which are available to the public at www.ode.state.or.us. Paper copies of the report cards will be available on or before January 15 each year in the main office at each school. The state assessment process provides much of the information in the report cards. Each year, Willamina School District administers the Smarter Balanced Assessments in English/Language Arts and Math to all students, unless exempted by OAR 581-022-2110, in 3-8 and grade 11 as well as Science for students in grades 5, 8, and 11, assessment results are posted on the web at www.ode.state.or.us.

Athletics

As always, athletics plays an important role in our educational system and Willamina students are gaining valuable education experiences outside the traditional classroom. Research has shown that students involved in activities have higher grade point averages, lower dropout rates, fewer discipline problems, and are less likely to engage in risky behaviors than students who are not involved in school-related activities. The staff at Willamina greatly encourages students to get involved in a variety of activities throughout the year. In the fall, football, volleyball, and cross-country are offered at both the middle and high schools. In the winter, basketball, and wrestling are offered at both the middle and high school. During the spring, the track is offered at both the middle and high schools. Baseball and softball are also available at the high school during the spring season.

Safety of School Sports - Concussions in accordance with OAR 581-022-2215

Willamina has an evidence-based concussion management educational plan in place. All district coaches receive annual concussion management training and must provide documentation of

completing the certification. The training our coaches receive is a state-implemented program that abides.

by OSAA (Oregon School Activities Association) guidelines.

Anabolic Steroids & Performance Enhancing Substances In accordance with OAR 581-022-2210

A steroid and performance educational plan is in place. The educational plan includes: state standards embedded within the district health curriculum, district rules in the [Willamina Student Handbook](#), controlled substance abuse, which is available online for students and parents, and training for all coaches every four years.

Agreements with Voluntary Organizations - 581-022-2308

A district shall adopt, and adhere to, a policy under which it may be a member of and pay fees, if any, to a voluntary organization that administers interscholastic activities or that facilitates the scheduling and programming of interscholastic activities only if the organization: focuses on equity, prohibits discrimination, and maintains a transparent complaint process.

Assessment of Essential Skills OAR 581-022-2115/581-022-2120

As required, each student is assessed on several essential skills as determined by the Oregon Department of Education. Students in grades 3 through 8 are required to be assessed in some or all of the following subject areas:

- Writing
- Speaking
- Mathematical problem-solving
- Scientific inquiry

Consistent with OAR 581-022-2115, the district allows ELL students to demonstrate proficiency in all required Essential Skills in the students' language of origin.

High school students must also submit at least one or more work samples in each of the subject areas listed above which fulfills the requirement of students to demonstrate proficiency in the Essential Skills to achieve the high school diploma or modified diploma. Students must be able to demonstrate the following essential skills:

- Read and comprehend a variety of texts
- Write clearly and accurately
- Apply mathematics in a variety of settings

Willamina School District adheres to the requirements to administer, score, manage, and document the students' proficiency in the Essential Skills required to receive a high school diploma or modified diploma.

Policies on Reporting Child Abuse OAR 581-022-2205

Willamina School District has adopted policies applicable to all school district employees and board members specifying that child abuse by school employees is not tolerated. Furthermore, all school employees and board members must report suspected child abuse to a law enforcement agency or the Department of Human Services.

District Curriculum OAR 581-022-2030

Willamina School District has developed a K-12 curriculum, which is aligned with the common curriculum goals and academic content standards for all subject areas. Curriculum maps, class syllabi, and daily lesson plans reflect the alignment to the standards. Our k-12 vertical planning teams ensure the curriculum is reviewed annually. WSD board policies provide the documentation of compliance with Oregon Administrative Rules as each is referenced to reflect the applicable OARs.

Teacher Training Related to Dyslexia 581-022-2440 & 2445

Willamina School District ensures that at least one teacher in the elementary school has received training related to dyslexia.

Willamina School District universally screens for risk factors of dyslexia in kindergarten through grade 2, using a screening test that is on the Department's approved list referenced in 581-002-1820 and administering the measures in each area in 581-002-1820(2)(b) with fidelity as per the guidelines of the test developers.

Diploma Requirements

Willamina High School is in full compliance with all Oregon high school diploma requirements. Students have several **credit options**, including passing approved coursework and/or demonstrating proficiency in the subject matter. Student progress may be reviewed as to their need for a modified diploma or extended diploma, based on their individual needs. Students who do not meet the requirements for a high school diploma based on their needs and education plan may be eligible for an alternative certificate. OAR 581-022-2000 thru 2025. The Veterans Diploma is available for those who meet the criteria. OAR 581-022-2005.

Special Education for Children with Disabilities 581-022-2315

Willamina School District provides educational programs for all resident children with a disability who are eligible under ORS Chapter 343. The program shall be carried out in accordance with all applicable Oregon Administrative Rules. Each school has a licensed special education teacher to oversee this requirement.

Alternative Education Programs

For a variety of reasons, some students may not choose to take full advantage of the typical high school setting. Willamina School District sponsors an Alternative School at the Oaken Hills Campus. Students enrolled participate in a rigorous online curriculum. Priority is given to upperclassmen, students who are credit-deficient, in jeopardy of suspension/expulsion, and/or students with erratic attendance. OAR 581-022-2505

Prevention Education Programs in Drugs and Alcohol OAR 581-022-2045

The district's drug, alcohol, and tobacco curriculum will be age-appropriate, reviewed annually, and updated as necessary to reflect current research. Drug, alcohol, and tobacco prevention instruction will be integrated into the district's health education courses. Students not enrolled in health education shall receive such instruction through other designated courses. Instruction shall minimally meet the requirements outlined in Oregon Administrative Rules.

Human Sexuality Education: OAR 581-022-2050

Willamina School District implements a K-12 health curriculum that is based on the common curriculum goals, content standards, and state and district policies. Willamina School District also has the

following policies in place regarding human sexuality education:

Emergency Plans and Safety Programs

The Willamina School District maintains a comprehensive safety program for all employees and students. It includes plans for responding to emergencies. A program with instructions on basic emergency procedures for each laboratory and shop, including identification of common physical, chemical, and electrical hazards is in place.

Necessary safety devices and instructions for their use are in each building. A safety/prevention in-service program for all employees is held at the beginning of each school year and may be conducted periodically and documented throughout the year as needed. Documented incidents are reviewed at the monthly Safety Committee meeting and a plan is put in place to eliminate the same incident from reoccurring. Each student receives age-appropriate safety instruction throughout the year. Regularly scheduled and documented safety inspections are performed to ensure that facilities and programs are maintained and operated in a manner that protects the safety of all students and employees. Reports of accidents involving school district property, or involving employees, students, or visiting public, as well as prompt investigation of all accidents, application of appropriate corrective measures, and monthly and annual analyses of accident data and trends are reviewed at safety meetings. OAR 581-022-2225.

Media Programs 581-022-2340

Willamina School District provides a media program consistent with district, program, and course goals which: provides an organized media center with materials, equipment, and services supervised by appropriate certificated personnel. The program provides for students to; locate and retrieve organized print and nonprint media, use media to record and express ideas and knowledge, and listen to, view, interpret, and analyze media materials.

Career Education

Career education is infused in various core classes as required by the Oregon Department of Education and the State of Oregon Diploma Requirements. Students are introduced to proper interview

techniques, resume writing, job skills, and various career-related learning standards just to name a few. Throughout their four years, students are briefly introduced to a variety of career opportunities and the requirements and qualifications necessary to pursue these career strands. In addition, we have three full-time Career Technical Education (CTE) teachers. Our CTE program includes instruction in the trades; welding, construction, design technology, and mechanics.

Health Services

The district provides an incident prevention-oriented health service program for all students consisting of ongoing training of selected staff in first aid, CPR, and specific health management plans. In addition, annual training is provided regarding communicable diseases and blood-borne pathogens. The district collects and maintains records regarding immunization. Screening occurs in early elementary grades for hearing and vision. A registered nurse provides consultation and coordination of services for students who are medically fragile or have special health care needs. All school buildings within the school district have plans for responding to medical emergencies. OAR 581-022-2220

Comprehensive School Counseling

Middle and High School Students in the district have access to an academic and career guidance coordinator who assists students with their schedules. High school students also discuss their post-high school plans which can include postsecondary education options, **work** preferences, college applications, and financial aid processes.

Auxiliary Services

Transportation

The district contracts with First Student Bus Company, Inc. to provide bus services. First Student

transports approximately 600 students daily. First Student and the Willamina Board of Education's combined goal is to provide safe and efficient transportation for all of the students in the Willamina School District. OAR 581-022-2345

Operations/Facilities/Custodial

Our custodial staff maintains approximately 180,000 square feet of buildings and approximately 40 acres of grounds. Our buildings range in age from 1980-2014. Our focus this year will be preventative maintenance throughout the district's buildings. It is our goal to provide safe, clean, and efficient facilities according to our **Healthy and Safe School Plan**, for our students, staff, and community, free from hazards, which include; asbestos, lead, and radon. OAR 581-022-2223, 2230, 2345

School Food Service

Willamina School District operates the Oregon Department of Education (ODE) and United States Department of Agriculture's (USDA) National School Breakfast Program (NSBP) and National School Lunch Program (NSLP), under the rules and guidelines set forth by the ODE and USDA. OAR 581-022-2345.

Operating Policies and Procedures

As the year develops, so do the policies and procedures that the district uses. The Oregon School Boards Association (OSBA) reviews and updates school policies and sends them to the district for revision, acceptance and adoption. The Willamina Board of Education periodically reviews these drafts throughout the year and adopts them accordingly. The District is currently completing a complete rewrite of all District Policies. A notebook of school board-adopted policies and procedures is kept in the superintendent's office and is available for view by the public. In addition, the district completes an annual report that notifies the public of our compliance with Division 22 standards. This report is posted to our district website at www.willamina.k12.or.us/documents. OAR 581-022-2305

Required Instructional Time

Each year Willamina School District adopts a school calendar that complies with all federal, state, and Department of Education requirements. A copy of

that calendar is on file at the district office and on the district website. For calendar year 2019-20, grades 6-12 receive over 1,100 instructional hours; and grades K-5 receive over 1,000 instructional hours. Each of the grade levels receives more hours of instruction than the state requires. OAR 581-022-2320

Daily Class Size 581-022-2335

The Willamina Board of Education has a goal for the classroom student-to-teacher ratio. Over the past few years, Willamina School District has been able to lower the ratio at the Elementary level by adding staff. OAR 581-022-2335

Instructional Materials OAR 581-022-2355

School districts have the option of adopting instructional materials in place of or in addition to those adopted by the State Board of Education. OAR 581-022-2350

Following the adoption of instructional materials by the State Board of Education, Willamina School District selects and adopts materials for each program and course in grades K-12 in accordance with Board Policy IIA and with the National Instructional Materials Accessibility Standard (NIMAS) on a cycle as established by the State Board of Education. OAR 581-022-2355

If a district seeks to postpone regular purchase of state-adopted materials, it shall submit an application to the Oregon Department of Education. OAR 581-022-2360

Records and Reports

In compliance with OAR 581-022-2260, Willamina School District provides all records and reports required by the Oregon Department of Education (ODE). Student activity funds are collected and expended by the law and reviewed each year by the district auditors. Student education records are maintained in accordance with law. In

addition, the district is required to work cooperatively with the local education service district in reviewing school district operations and preparing and submitting an annual report to the State Board of Education. Willamina works with the Willamette Education Service District which serves Marion, Polk, and Yamhill Counties.

Complaint Procedures

In accordance with OAR 581-022-2370, each school district must establish a process for the prompt resolution of a complaint by a person who resides in the district or by any parent or guardian of a student who attends school in the district. The process must be in writing and state clearly, who within the district has the responsibility for responding to the complaint. A complaint form can be obtained from the district office. Please refer to the complaint process defined in Policy KL.

Report on PE Data

According to OAR 581-022-2265, the Willamina School District submits an annual Physical Education Data Report to the Oregon Department of Education. The report includes:

- 1) The number of minutes of physical education that is provided to students in grades kindergarten through grade 8 each school week in each public school building.
- 2) The physical capacity of public schools to provide students in grades kindergarten through grade 5 with at least 150 minutes of physical education during each school **week** and to provide students in grades 6 through 8 with at least 225 minutes of physical education during each school week.
- 3) The additional facilities required by public schools to provide physical education to students for the minimum number of minutes as described in #2.

Evaluations 581-002-2410

Willamina School District licensed instructors are certified through the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission (TSPC). All first, second, and third-year probationary teachers are formally evaluated each year for the first three years while contract teachers are formally evaluated at least biennially. Informal and formal classroom observations happen frequently throughout the school year. Willamina

School District's classified staff includes administrative assistants, instructional assistants, secretaries, cafeteria personnel, and custodial/maintenance staff. These positions vary in hours worked per day, but all positions have a direct impact on the education of the students. All classified employees are formally evaluated within the first 60 days of employment and then annually thereafter by their immediate supervisor. Informal observations occur frequently throughout the school year. This applies to confidential staff as well.

Willamina shall use the core **teaching standards to evaluate teacher effectiveness** outlined in OAR 581-022-2410. Performances, essential knowledge, and critical dispositions for each standard are contained within the Interstate Teacher Assessment and Support Consortium (InTASC). The Core Teaching Standards include; 1. Learner & learning. 2. Content. 3. Instruction. 4. Professional Practice. OAR 581-022-2415

Willamina shall use the **educational leadership-administrator standards to evaluate administrator** effectiveness outlined in OAR 581-022-2410. These standards include: 1. Visionary Leadership. 2. Instructional Improvement. 3. Effective Management. 4. Inclusive Practice. 5. Ethical Leadership. 6. Socio-Political Context. 581-022-2420

Personnel Policies and Procedures

Personnel Policies and Procedures OAR 581-022-2400. Willamina School District reviews personnel issues and updates school board policies and procedures annually. The Staff Handbook was updated in August 2018. The following are included in the handbook and board policies:

Willamina School District personnel policies follow all local, state, and federal administrative rules, guidelines, and laws. OAR 581-022-2405 The Oregon Department of Education oversees all fingerprint background checks. Once the Oregon Department of Education processes the information, they provide the district with confirmation of status. All Willamina employees are required to have a fingerprint/background check. OAR 581-022-2430.

All volunteers have a criminal history background check and are not allowed to volunteer until results are processed.

Willamina School District has adopted policies applicable to all district employees specifying that child abuse by school employees is not tolerated. Furthermore, all school employees must report suspected child abuse to a law enforcement agency or the Department of Human Services as required by ORS 4196.010 and 419B.015 and report suspected child abuse to the employees' supervisors. All Willamina employees are trained each year on the prevention, identification, and reporting of child abuse under ORS 4198.005 to 4198.050.

Exception of Students with Disabilities from Statewide Assessment Testing

All students are required to participate in statewide assessments. Special Education students may be exempted from testing if the parent submits a request for exemption and the request becomes part of the student's Individual Education Program, as provided by OAR 581-022-2110.

Operational Plans 581-022-0106(4)

School districts must periodically submit to the Department a plan for operation during the school year, including communicable disease management plans.

Kindergarten Assessment

All kindergarten students who enroll at Willamina School District during the testing window will participate in the Kindergarten Assessment as directed by the Oregon Department of Education. OAR 581-022-2130. In addition, all kindergarteners

and their families will be invited to participate in a four-day transition camp before the start of the new school year.
