COURSE OVERVIEW

In Geography CP, students will examine the relationships among people, places, and environments that result in patterns on the Earth's surface. Students use the tools and methods of geography to study the principal themes, such as the influence of geography on the events of the past and present, and analyze how location affects economic activities in different economic systems throughout the world. Students compare how components of culture shape the characteristics of regions and analyze the impact of technology and human modifications on the physical environment. Students use problem-solving and decision-making skills to ask and answer geographic questions.

GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Students will be provided with a variety of instructional strategies in order to engage each student and enhance his/her knowledge of Geography. The class is student-centered, with a wide range of activities consisting of group and individual learning opportunities, with research projects and writing assignments.

Applying vocabulary for each topic will be valuable to gain a complete overview of Geography. Students will be able to explore their strengths as learners and also be able to use those strengths to excel in all different areas of the classroom environment. Through the range of activities presented throughout the year, the student will be able to fine tune their learning strengths in order to be successful in future social studies classes.

Students will be able to meet the required South Carolina State Standards for Geography by the end of the course. We will be covering the following SC State Standards this semester:
