Syllable/word structure

Syllables may take any of the following forms:

PC

NC

ONC

Where:

A word consists of a PC, NC, or ONC syllable followed by any number of NC or ONC syllables.

Advantages:

Lotsa possible syllables (84 PC, 432 NC, 9288 ONC)

Disadvantages:

No other advantages

OR:

Phonotactics

Any two liquids ("I", "r", "m", "n") in a row within a word are explicitly disallowed (even if one or both are syllabic).

Codas that precede an identical sound become "p" ("...is.si..."=>"...ip.si...").
