DISTRICT LEADERS

A District Leader is an unpaid volunteer elected Democratic Party official (not a governmental official). All formal parties in New York State are required to have at least one District Leader (DL) per Assembly District (AD). These positions are subject to primary elections every two years. This ostensibly guarantees that any party with formal status in New York State (e.g. a permanent ballot line) is democratically governed by its members. In essence, the District Leader is the representative of the party members in their district to that political party's apparatus. 



NYS LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR – BRIAN BENJAMIN

The **lieutenant governor of New York** is a constitutional office in the executive branch of the Government of the State of New York. It is the second highest-ranking official in state government. The lieutenant governor is elected on a ticket with the governor for a four-year term. Official duties dictated to the lieutenant governor under the present New York Constitution are to serve as president of the state senate, serve as acting governor in the absence of the governor from the state or the disability of the governor, or to become governor in the event of the governor's death, resignation or removal from office via impeachment. Additional statutory duties of the lieutenant governor are to serve on the New York Court for the Trial of Impeachments, the State Defense Council, and on the board of trustees of the College of Environmental Science and Forestry.



The office has been in existence in some form since 1626, under the Dutch colonial government of New Netherlands. The Attorney General advises the executive branch of state government and defends actions and proceedings on behalf of the state. The Attorney General acts independently of the Governor of New York. The department's regulations are compiled in title 13 of the *New York Codes, Rules and Regulations* (NYCRR).





If you see bad behavior (no masks, no social distancing, overserving, noise, etc.) from any establishment, there are two things you can do that actually do have a positive impact:

- 1. Fill out an online complaint form (takes about 2 minutes) on the SLA (State Liquor Authority) website: slacomplaints.ny.gov/clientapp
 - a. This is far better than a 311 call.
 - b. When the SLA gets a certain number of complaints, they do act.
- 2. Email Nelly Gonzalez (<u>negonzalez@cb.nyc.gov</u>) and Jesse Bodine (<u>jbodine@cb.nyc.gov</u>) at Community Board 4 about the problem.

You can also copy the email to Ariel Palitz (apalitz@media.nyc.gov), the Director of the Mayor's Office of Nightlife. She is very pro bar (was the owner of the Sutra Lounge, one of the most notorious bars in the East Village for a decade where she was fined almost \$30k by the SLA), but copying her will let her know that residents are fed up.

AGGRESSIVE SOLICITATION

NYC Administrative Code. Title 10: Public Safety. Chapter 1: Public Safety. § 10-136 Prohibition against certain forms of aggressive solicitation.

- (1) No person shall solicit, ask or beg in an aggressive manner in any public place. ...
- "Aggressive manner" shall mean:
 - (a) Approaching or speaking to a person, or following a person before, during or after soliciting, asking or begging, if that conduct is intended or is likely to cause a reasonable person to (i) fear bodily harm to oneself or to another, damage to or loss of property, or the commission of any offense as defined in section ten of the penal law upon oneself or another, or (ii) otherwise be intimidated into giving money or other thing of value, or (iii) suffer unreasonable inconvenience, annoyance or alarm;
 - (b) Intentionally touching or causing physical contact with another person or an occupied vehicle without that person's consent in the course of soliciting, asking or begging;
 - (c) Intentionally blocking or interfering with the safe or free passage of a
 pedestrian or vehicle by any means, including unreasonably causing a
 pedestrian or vehicle operator to take evasive action to avoid physical contact; or
 - o (d) Using violent or threatening gestures toward a person solicited.

ARRESTABLE OFFENSES

Reminder of arrestable/reportable offenses:

- Harassment (gets in one's face, pushes for money, tries to touch you, follows you)
- Public Erotic Acts (Masturbation, Sex of any kind)
- Open Drug usage or dealing
- Threatening with weapons of any kind
- Robberies
- Looting
- Menacing
- etc.

If you see ANY of these acts occurring please call 911 or any of the direct numbers listed above.
