

Course Description:

This course is designed for the student who has a primary language other than English, and is not proficient in listening, speaking, reading, writing, or comprehension in the English speaking classroom. Instruction will be provided in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, writing, and comprehension to assist students in classrooms where English is the language of instruction. Students will receive skills to aid in the transition to all academic areas. Limited English proficiency should be determined by an approved language assessment instrument.

- 1. Improve English skills in the areas of listening, speaking, reading, and writing.
- 2. Demonstrate English proficiency through class assessments.
- 3. Demonstrate English proficiency through the state ACCESS test.

SmartPass

Grading Practices

Late Work Policy
