



Instructions for the logical framework matrix

PROJECT LOGIC

Overall objective – State the long-term development goal your project contributes to. Preferably, identify a single overall objective and ensure the wording is consistent with the one used in the application form.

Specific objective – Outline the intended direct effect or specific change the project aims to achieve. It is advisable to have only one, phrased identically to that in the application form.

Results — Describe the concrete outcomes the project will deliver. Number the results using ordinal numbers (e.g., Result 1, Result 2). It is recommended not to list more than three results.

Activity – List the key actions that will be carried out to achieve each result. Each activity should be clearly linked to a result (e.g., activities under Result 1 should be labeled A.1.1, A.1.2, etc.). Make sure activity descriptions align exactly with those in the application form.

INDICATORS

Define performance indicators for each level: overall objective, specific objective, and results. Indicators must be specific, measurable, attainable, and time-bound, reflecting the changes the project intends to bring about.

SOURCES OF VERIFICATION

For every indicator, specify how the achievement will be confirmed. These are documents or forms of evidence that support your reported progress. Sources might include: official reports, attendance lists, media coverage, photographs, published studies, websites, evaluation forms, etc. Indicators and their sources of verification should be developed together.
