# #Firearm Privacy Act

#### ##Section 1. Purpose

This bill is to protect the citizens of the United States from tyranny. This bill will effectively ban any sort of firearm (unless fully automatic, explosive, or larger than .50 caliber) or firearm part registry on a state or federal level. In addition, this bill applies to other weapons such as knives, swords, nunchucks, and brass knuckles.

## ##Section 2. Defining Terms

- a. A "registry" is defined as any list, collection, or record of information or data about the owner, manufacturer, distributor, or the families of any of the aforementioned, or the technical, physical, or aesthetic nature of any weapon.
- b. A "weapon" is defined as any instrument that is produced for the purpose of self-defense in a way that will inflict bodily harm against an attacker

#### ##Section 3. Enforcement

- a. The FBI shall be tasked with the enforcement of the provisions of this act.
- b. Any member of any state assembly or state government who establishes, maintains, funds, or enforces any form of weapon registry for or which contains weapons or weapon parts manufactured outside of their state in whole or in part, commits a felony that may be punished by a fine of not more than \$10,000 and imprisonment for not more than six months.

### ##Section 4. Repealed Laws

#### ##Section 5. Amendments

23 USC §158 (a) (1) (A) is amended to read:

The Secretary shall withhold 10 per centum of the amount required to be apportioned to any State under each of sections 104(b)(1), 104(b)(3), and 104(b)(4) [1] of this title on the first day of each fiscal year after the second fiscal year beginning after September 30, 1985, in which the purchase or public possession in such State of any alcoholic beverage by a person who is less than twenty-one years of age is lawful \*\*or in which there exists a formal registry of weapons or weapons parts.\*\*

# ##Section 6. Implementation

This bill shall take effect 90 days after enactment.
