

Pacific Seabirds Content Submission Guidelines

- All content must be submitted via the [Pacific Seabirds Submission Form](#).
- Contributors are invited to submit the following:
 - Article (such as a report on current topics, either in research, management, or conservation, or other topics within or outside PSG). Note: if a topic may be controversial, the Editor reserves the right to invite comment or an accompanying article that may present another viewpoint.
 - Creative Writing (poems, stories, etc.)
 - Visual Art
 - Photography
 - Equipment Review
 - Book Review
 - Short Scientific Note (this may include any seabird species worldwide)
 - Or anything else, such as conservation news or other news items!
- The submission form allows the upload of content as a document (.doc, .docx), pdf (.pdf), or image (.jpeg, .jpg, .png, etc.).
- We ask that you upload written pieces as a document (.doc, .docx) and keep to a **word count of 1,000 words or less**.
- Please upload images or figures separately (at the highest resolution possible); do not embed images in a document. Our form allows you to upload up to five content pieces (as a document, pdf, or image).
- If you have multiple images or figures, please upload a document with the correct captions or legends and full credits/acknowledgements.
- If you have a different file type for your submission, please email it to editor@pacificseabirdgroup.org and include your name and contact information.
- Deadlines are March 15th (for content in the Spring edition) and September 15th (for content in the Fall edition).
- The Editor and/or Associate Editor may follow-up with you with questions about your submission. Please note that the Editor and Associate Editors may edit text (for conciseness, grammatical correctness, and word count); they may also resize images to fit to our website.

- Article: Seabirds in Music (example: compile Spotify playlist from responses on the PSG ListServ)
- Article: Faces of Seabird Conservation (from meeting submissions)

- Regular Update: Where are our PSG Members now? (could include updates on new jobs, graduations, retirements, etc.)
- Regular Update: Upcoming events (PSG meeting announcements, other meetings, other relevant events/workshops, etc...)
- Free gear and equipment
- Observations/stories/tips from the field
- Highlights about relevant journalism/reporting about Pacific seabird species, habitat, and other topics (e.g., such as the role of STEM, diversity, and inclusion in field science)
