Xoloitzcuintli (pronunciation: "Show-low-eatz-queen-tlee") remains one of the most ancient dog breeds. Also known as Mexican Hairless dogs or Xoloitzcuintles, Xolo dogs have a sacred place in Mexican culture. The breed is mostly **hairless**, which makes the Xolo dog <a href="https://docs.no.in/hypoallergenic">hypoallergenic</a>, and therefore, a perfect companion for allergy sufferers.

**Loyal, cheerful,** and **affectionate**, the Xoloitzcuintli dog will do anything for its family. They are **active** and have a **protective** side, which means they can be great **watchdogs**. Since Xolos are **highly** <u>intelligent</u>, training them is straightforward, but their <u>independent</u> nature means you will have to be consistent and set boundaries.

Xoloitzcuintli, named after the Aztec god of lightning and death, has been around for over 3500 years! These <u>primitive</u> canines were believed to be sent by God as healers and guards of the living. # The Xoloitzcuintli's Physical Characteristics (skip this section)

The sturdy and strong Xoloitzcuintli dog breed comes in three sizes:

Size Variety	Height	Weight
Toy Xolo	10-14 inches (23-36 cm)	5–15 pounds (2.3–6.8 kg)
Miniature Xolo	15-18 inches (38-51 cm)	15–30 pounds (6.8–14 kg)
Standard Xolo	19-23 inches (51-76 cm)	25-40 pounds (11-18 kg)

With their expressive almond-shaped eyes, the Xolo dog gives an impression of a thoughtful and vivacious companion. The eye color can range from yellow to black. However, one distinctive feature is their bat-like ears that stand erect, giving an alert impression.

The head is wedge-shaped, and the <u>muzzle</u> is long. Nose color depends on the skin color, which can be black, slate, gray-black, liver, red, or bronze. Hairless Xolo dogs are also known for missing their premolars.

# Xoloitzcuintli Dogs Hypoallergenic Coat (skip this section)

Xolo dog's hypoallergenic coat comes in two variants:

- 1. **Hairless Xoloitzcuintles**: The absence of hair is the primary characteristic of this variety. However, patches of short rough hair may be present on the head, paws, and tip of the tail.
- 2. **Coated Xoloitzcuintles**: These types of Xolo dogs have a short and smooth coat covering the whole body uniformly. The hair can be of any color.

The low to non-shedding coat makes the Xolo dog hypoallergenic. With your Mexican hairless dog, you won't have to worry about allergies or dog hair on your couch.

# Xoloitzcuintli Temperament (skip this section)

Xolo dogs are **calm**, **affectionate**, and **cheerful**. **Family-oriented** — they are **incredibly faithful**. Xolos are **protective** of their loved ones and make fantastic **guardians** and an **excellent companion or family dog** — given the right training. They get along with other dogs and are **cat friendly**.

Although **independent**, Xolo dogs are also known to be <u>Velcro dogs</u>. Your Xolo will follow you around the house and try to be as close to you as possible.

### **Exercise & Training**

Encouraging Good Behavior in Your Xoloitzcuintli (skip this section)

<u>Intelligent</u> and **active**, Xoloitzcuintli are **highly trainable**. If trained right since puppyhood, they do well in <u>agility</u> and other competitions.

The Xoloitzcuintli dog breed tends to suffer from <u>separation anxiety</u> if left alone for a long period and can be **wary** of strangers. Therefore, your Xolo puppy needs <u>crate</u> <u>training</u> as well as socialization training from day one!

Xolo dogs are a **medium-energy** dog breed. A daily long walk and some playtime with the family would keep your pup happy and healthy.

### Xoloitzcuintli Grooming

Xolo dogs' hypoallergenic coat requires minimal grooming. They are mostly hairless, so you don't have to worry about coat trimming or brushing. Expert groomers advise giving them a bath once a month using a <u>good moisturizing shampoo</u>. This will ensure that they don't lose essential skin oils because of excessive bathing.

Ear cleaning and claw trimming of your Xolo dogs should be a part of the weekly grooming regime. Whereas, regular teeth brushing keeps the dental problems away.

#### Xoloitzcuintli Health Issues and Care
