Joelle – A couple of other AHA volunteers and myself assisted with the hands-on practice portion where students had an opportunity to practice hands-only CPR while we worked with them to improve their form and comfortability with the skill. We started by reviewing proper form and steps leading up to CPR and closed by having them put it all together to the beat of Stayin' Alive by the Bee Gees to help them remember the appropriate rhythm. I was impressed by the scale of this event, and found the colored band system for student rotations to be very effective. We assigned 1-2

volunteers per row of students to provide feedback and answer questions throughout the training session, with one bilingual volunteer to translate instruction into Spanish when needed.

# Student perspective - Shakyra

## Things to improve:

Station experienced, bilingual volunteers in the choking relief, hands-only CPR, and AED training areas.

Have students practicing CPR face away from students waiting in the stands to prevent distraction.

Hold a short run of show meeting with volunteers prior to event start to physically walk them through each station, assign placement, and review roles.

Signage for volunteer parking area.

Name tags for volunteers and coaching staff.

Audio cable to project Stayin' Alive or another 100-120bpm song while students practice compressions.

# Why is AHA doing this

## Discuss the grant

Joelle – Pasadena High School was one of 350 grantees across the nation who received two CPR in Schools Training Kits courtesy of our national CPR in Schools sponsor, Ross Stores. The Ross CPR in Schools Grant was a competitive grant for public high schools with 50%+ of their students eligible for free and reduced-price lunch. Each school was required to train at least 200 students, or one full grade level of students (whichever number was smaller).
