I built this doc for my own job search to help me find as many climate-related positions as possible.

This document aggregates websites that aggregate climate-related (mostly tech) job postings. (This is not just a list of individual climate-related companies' jobs pages).

- A "date" column is included so if you want, you can record the date you last searched the website (as I did during my own search).

1. Aggregated Portfolio Job Pages:

Nowadays, it's common for venture capital and other investment firms to name the companies they invest in (their "portfolio companies") on their website. Even more useful for job-seekers is when these investment firms have a page where they aggregate job openings at all of their portfolio companies. That's what I've linked to below.

2. Miscellaneous Climate Job Aggregators:

These sites aggregate jobs from numerous companies catering to either climate or tech roles. Searching them is pretty straightforward.


The BuiltIn websites have job boards dedicated to tech roles by city (though include many remote roles). It's not climate-specific however. Example jobsites are https://builtin.com/jobs/boston and https://builtin.com/jobs/remote/colorado

Multi-site "Google Hack" Search:

These searches are <u>very powerful</u>, but take a moment to understand. They let you across all postings of a single talent management service. You don't need to understand how it works to use it, but I've included a bit on that below.

These searches work because 1) Google allows you to search text on a specific domain, and 2) many modern talent management websites actually host their customer's roles on the talent company's domain, not the website of the hiring company. If that's confusing, here's a specific example: The company SenseiAg uses the talent management service Greenhouse to manage its job postings. The Sensei Ag job postings are posted at this url: https://boards.greenhouse.io/senseiag — which is on Greenhouse's domain, not Sensei Ag's.

Here's a screenshot example below to clarify this further. Follow the instructions in the below table to construct searches of the different talent service sites. Try out a few variations to see what searches surface the most relevant results for you.
