JANUARY 2026

January went by quickly and the children were busy doing lots of crafts.

The children that attended the AM program made a gingerbread house, with lots of candy on it!! It was fun, but a little messy!!!!

Some of the crafts the children participated in were: made Shrinky dink bracelets and necklaces, designed animals/flowers using pipe cleaners, used Sculpey clay (which I then bake to harden) to make figures, animals, food, and many other original items, they used pony beads to make some wonderful, beaded animal keychains and painted wooden animal bookmarks.

Our Wednesday coding class has been using Lego Robotics to build and then code their movements with scratch and driving them on the iPads This has been a fun and educational weekly program which the children enjoy!!!!

The children made *Worry Dolls*, in Spanish is Munecas quitapenas, which means, dolls that remove worries. Using clothes pins and embroidery yarn they made little dolls which are referred to as trouble dolls. These small colorful dolls are a traditional Guatemalan toy. A person places the doll under their pillow after telling it something that is bothering them and then goes to sleep. Overnight, the worry dolls are said to worry in the person's place, letting them sleep peacefully. Many children have told me they are not having bad dreams anymore and are sleeping better!!!! Whatever works!!!!
