

HIGH SCHOOL REMOTE LEARNING PLAN

Throughout the course of the 2020-21 school year, various circumstances may arise that prevent students from physically attending school. Concerns for students and their families that may impact attendance could include but may not be limited to are: quarantine, exposure, high-risk health conditions, and anxiety. Although we want all students back in our classrooms because that is where best learning occurs, North Platte Public Schools will support parents if they chose remote learning. We have listed remote learning criteria for your child. Through communication and trust, we believe we will get through this tough time and continue in our purpose to prepare students to be productive, responsible citizens in a safe, caring, supportive learning environment.

- As recommended by the Nebraska Department of Education, the student will work for a minimum of 3 – 4 hours/day (15/hours per week)
- Make academic progress that does NOT take them off-pace for graduation. In a full-term, this would equal up to 20 credit hours of work completed every nine weeks.
- Students will be assigned a full schedule that will keep him/her on pace for graduation.
- A point-of-contact will review the student's progress and communicate with students/families as needed.
- A student may request remote learning at any time throughout the school year but may not be able to recover credits if they do not complete the classes from which they were currently enrolled.
- A student may come back into the school for physical attendance only at the start of one of the nine-week terms.

By signing this document, both the parent and student agree to remote learning requirements set forth by the district. Failure to comply with the remote learning plan could result in a loss of credits and could jeopardize the student to be on track for graduation.
