- Just wanted to get some exercise and relaxation
- This was pre Geocaching app, I would type the coords into apple maps and then have the 2 dots meet. I would also print out pages if in the woods so I didn't waste battery life.
- Soon after the app Geopher Lite came out. Used that until the real app came out.

SB:

- Got my first gps for Fathers Day 2009 and used it whenever in the forest.
- Geocaching app came out and it really changed the game! Still only used it for urban caching at the time
- Jewocaching Day was born!

- Gives us the failed Challenges!

- Around 2011 I was really hitting my stride getting over 2k a year and doing the Chicago Geocacher Podcast. Made me want to cache.
- A little while later the iphones and cases were getting better and I pretty much went exclusively to the iPhone

CC:

 March 2011 - 133 day cacheless streak ended in Xi'an China - 1 cache in 100mi radius. Offline maps, no caching app, no data, but got it! Printed out a Sat image of the location, outside of the Terracotta Warriors Exhibit.

SK:

- In the spring of 2011, my mom had gone out to Portland to visit her sister. She came home with a GPS borrowed from her brother and told me all about geocaching. I thought it sounded like fun!
- I created my account May 1, 2011 and found a free app (c:geo) for my phone to give it a try. I did try and then tried again and again.
- I finally found my first cache on June 1, 2011. It was a bison tube on a light pole in a residential neighborhood. I remember sitting there on the curb holding the container in my hand and signing the log. I was so excited!
- I found a total of 19 caches in 2011 in 4 states IL, WV, OH, & IN. Some of these
 finds are still so memorable to me. I loved exploring the back roads of WV with
 my son and my sister. One find in OH actually took me two blocks from my
 ex-husband's grandparents house that was a surprise!
- My longest slump was 194 days, August 2011 to February 2012.

 Was really getting into Geocaching, went to my first Mega, the Texas Challenge, Groundspeak HQ, The Block Party, The Going APE event, Original Stash Plaque, Dr Who. A 10 Icon run day. So by the end of the year, I wasn't only hooked but infatuated. At this point I'm pretty much 100% paperless.



- Did some of the 'Challenges' even created some of them. Some weird, some cool, some just idiotic - yeah, I'm talking about things like taking a picture while touching Uranus at a planetarium - Sound familiar Snoogans? But without getting a smiley I quickly lost interest.
- Trying to run Wherigo's always crashing on both GPSr and Smartphone at that time. Back at this time, we'd get several of use together to do a Wherigo, all running the app, and hoping that someone managed to get to the end w/o it crashing. No longer an issue today.
- Smartphones were becoming more mainstream, and started geocaching primarily with the smartphone Though kept using GPSr on the longer hikes.

- I found a total of 90 caches in 2012, including my first virtual (Cloud Gate AKA The Bean). At this point, geocaching was something that I did as a broke single mom with my son, who was 5 at the time. We would go off on adventures in the parks in search of treasure!
- 65 of the 90 were in December. Guess who I had met that month!!
- Scott's Christmas gift to me this year was a Premium membership so I could find aaaaalllllllll the geocaches.
- With Scott, I found my first puzzle, multi, and earthcache.

- Geocaching Intro app introduced, later renamed simply Geocaching app

SB:

- By 2013 I was with Jessie and we were caching a ton and taking vacations to cache. Again only using an iPhone
- I start on the GCPC

CC:

- At this point annual Mega's became a thing. Was doing the Texas Challenge annual, and went to Geowoodstock for the first time. This is what I really love, I'm always with a lot of friends, hitting a lot of caches, and seeking out those that are truly interestings, or Icon Runs, hit a 11 Icon Run this year.
- Smartphone GPSr are improving, many are having GPS and GLONASS sat reception, improving both accuracy and likelihood of reception.
- Got a Garmin Oregon 600 when the released. First Handheld GPSr with a decent touch screen and most importantly, you could read it like paper in full sunlight w/o no backlight.

- My biggest geocaching year 3122 finds! Many, many firsts happened for me this year.
- January got my first (co) FTF!
- In February, I went to my first event Cabin Fever. Prior to this, I really didn't even realize that cachers actually knew each other.
- March Found my first gadget cache 10 for one? Which was an old pay phone that required you to put in a dime, turn a dial, and the cache container dropped out of the bottom.

- May Had my first 100+ day on the 400 trail in WI.
- May placed my first hides
- June Found the Original Stash Tribute Plaque with my son and my aunt who had originally told my mom about geoaching.

- August completed my first geoart Hummingbird series, included my first letterbox
- Also found my first wherigo in August
- Started streaking in August for the 31 days souvenirs and ended up lasting 201 days. I had to beat my longest slump so I could place a challenge.
- September found my first webcam
- December my first Jewocaching Day!
