- 1.] A 3-to-5-minute audio essay with the theme "What Are the Greatest Attributes of Our Democracy."
- 2.] Open to all public, private, home-schooled, or parochial students.
- 3.] They are due to participating VFW post nearest you by October 31st. (You may return them to the 5-12 office).
- 4.] Entries are available on line the Veterans of Foreign Wars site or by emailing Katie Dudley at katie.dudley@pineisland.k12.mn.us.
- 5.] No individual's name may be in the body of the audio essay or on the written copy, only on the entry form.
- 6.] Judging criteria: Originality: 30 points, Content: 35 points, Delivery: 35 points

- 1.] A 300 – 400 word essay with the theme, "How Are You Inspired by America." Essays should be typed in English with no color or graphics and the body should not identify the applicant in any way. Your personal information can only be on the entry form.

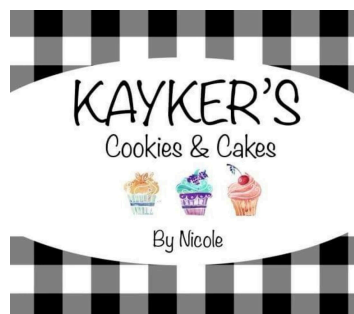
