For Pre-Approved Courses:

If you are taking a cours	e that is offered "by petition" it will not automatically show	up your degree audit. You will need
to a paper <u>submit a petit</u>	ion or send a message in the Virtual Advising Center aski	ng for the following:
"Please accept	, a Global Health Pre-Approved Course, towards _	requirements for
my Global Health	(Major/Minor)."	

For Transfer, Study Abroad and non-pre-approved courses:

- Complete an <u>Undergraduate Student Petition</u> Fill out a separate petition for each course that you are petitioning. Attach course syllabus
- On each petition include the course # (as it appears on TritonLink), course title, # of units, grade received, quarter/semester the course was taken, the University in which you were enrolled and specify the requirement you want to apply the course toward (e.g. Fulfill Global Health Major Elective Requirement). Please also sign and date the petition.
- Submit completed petition(s) & syllabus to the Global Health Advisor (The form can scanned and sent via email to ghpadvising@ucsd.edu or dropped off in the GHP Office).
- You will be notified via the Virtual Advising Center (http://vac.ucsd.edu) once your petition has been approved (please allow 2 weeks before contacting advisor)
