Exemplar:

Case: The Stanford Prison Experiment

Theory Applied: Differential Association Theory

Factors:

1. Criminal behavior is learned.
2. Criminal behavior is learned during interactions with others through communication.
3. All interactions with others are not equal. They can vary in frequency, intensity, priority, and duration.

How These Apply to this Case:

1. Criminal behavior is learned. Within the Stanford Prison Experiment we saw that some guards were not initially willing or inherently violent. Some were docile and attempting to verbally coerce the inmates into appropriate behavior. It was not until influenced that we saw a change in behavior.
2. Criminal behavior is learned during interactions with others through communication. The change in behavior I spoke of in factor #1 was due to the interactions with others through communication which led to violent behavior of guards to induce reactions from the inmates as well as the researchers.
3. All interactions with others are not equal. They can vary in frequency, intensity, priority, and duration. As the study went on, we saw an increase of

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abuse. Many guards felt pressured to increase intensity and frequency of said abuse.

Credibility: I believe this case reinforces the credibility of the Differential Association Theory because it demonstrated how individuals can learn deviant behaviors through exposure to negative influences. This was made clear by the transformation of ordinary college students into abusive guards and submissive prisoners within a simulated prison setting.
