**SUBJECT: APPEAL FOR RESOLUTION OF RESULT TAMPERING AND
MANIPULATION ISSUE ON COMPASSIONATE GROUNDS**

Dear Registrar,

I hope this letter finds you in good health and high spirits. I am writing to you as **Ejikeme Mmesoma**, a concerned candidate who recently took the JAMB examination. I am compelled to bring to your attention an issue that has greatly affected me and has caused significant distress and disappointment.

Firstly, I would like to express my utmost respect and admiration for the valuable work that the Joint Admissions and Matriculation Board (JAMB) carries out in ensuring fair and equitable opportunities for all candidates. **The JAMB Act of 2013, which grants you the power to address issues and incidents on compassionate grounds, serves as a testament to the Board's commitment to justice and fairness.**

Drawing from the relevant sections of the JAMB Act of 2013, specifically Section 10(1)(d), (e), and (f), I would like to highlight **the Registrar's discretionary powers** to waive or reduce registration fees, grant an extension of time for registration, and **approve special consideration for any applicant**. These sections emphasize the Registrar's authority to address individual circumstances and ensure justice is served in all cases, even those that may not fall under the strict guidelines of the JAMB Act.

To further emphasize the need for compassionate consideration, I would like to bring to your attention several incidents from previous years where candidates faced similar challenges of result tampering and manipulation. These incidents, as documented in the provided table, demonstrate the unfortunate reality that **technical glitches** and **external factors can significantly impact a candidate's results, often resulting in disqualification from the examination**.

It is evident that the JAMB Act of 2013 and **ITS COMPASSIONATE PROVISIONS WERE ESTABLISHED PRECISELY FOR SITUATIONS LIKE MINE, WHERE CANDIDATES BECOME UNINTENDED VICTIMS OF UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES**. I implore you to consider my case in light of the Act's overarching objective of fairness and justice for all applicants. I believe that an empathetic review of my situation will reveal the truth behind the technical glitch and allow my true abilities to be recognized.

I am willing to cooperate fully and provide any additional information or evidence that may assist in resolving this matter. I understand the need for a thorough investigation to maintain the integrity of the examination process. However, **I humbly request that you exercise your discretionary powers under the JAMB Act to ensure a just and compassionate resolution that takes into account the circumstances surrounding my case**.

I sincerely hope that my appeal will be given careful consideration and that justice will prevail.

Your intervention in this matter will not only restore my faith in the JAMB examination system but also serve as a testament to the Board's commitment to fairness, equality, and accessibility.
