- If students are using Google Forms for a quiz can the teacher block other tabs from being opened (like a secure browser format)? The teacher is concerned that while taking a history quiz the students have the online textbook open on a different tab. (Kris Baker)
- Is anyone using Google Cast for Education? I am having trouble getting my student's accounts/devices to "see" the receiver. (Kaylene Corcoran)
- We just noticed that when you delete a file from Shared with Me, it no longer deletes it from My Drive. When did that feature appear? I am sure in the past when you deleted a file from "Shared with Me", it removed it from My Drive.
