1) Introduction Section. Presents the objectives, relevance, context, scope, and organization supported by the Table of Contents (ToC).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Martini Glass: bowl. • Explain paper structure and organization. • Introduce the controversies, focus areas, and central theme(s). • Connect to the Summary and Conclusions section. 	
2) Background / Literature Review Section. Expands and discusses the ideas and topics introduced in the Introduction section.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Martini Glass: bowl, getting thinner. • Explain big picture connections, theory, and controversies. • Overview/summary of the types and examples of social conflicts (US and global) due to climate change; compile as a table. 	
3) Results Section(s). In-depth discussion of your focus areas.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Martini Glass: thin stem. • Include the big-picture connections that you introduced earlier. • Illustrate and discuss your focus areas with examples and case studies. 	
4) Discussion Section. Connects the Results section(s) back to the Background section using the central theme(s).	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Martini Glass: wide base. • How are your focus areas connected to the broader controversies around this topic? • Discuss climate change and social conflicts over time and space. 	
5) Summary and Conclusions Section. Ties together the paper in the broader context of climate change impacts, sustainability, and equity.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Martini Glass: wide base. • Summarize and emphasize. • Broader context: Why? So what? Who cares? • Connect back to the Introduction section using the central theme(s) and controversies. 	

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6) Figures and Tables. Uses properly-formatted and relevant figures and tables to support and illustrate the arguments and ideas presented.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Include a variety of useful and relevant figures and tables. • Include good captions. • Cited/referenced sequentially in the text at appropriate spots. • Compiled as a List of Figures and as a List of Tables. 	
7) Bibliography. Complete and professional.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Include a variety of reliable and relevant sources. • Use a consistent citation format. • Only include sources that you actually use in your paper. 	
8) Table of Contents, List of Figures, and List of Tables. Complete and professional.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Numbered sections with meaningful headings. • Numbered subsections with meaningful subheadings. • ToC matches the paper structure. • Include page numbers. 	
9) Organization. Presents a logical flow of arguments well-supported by evidence and illustrated using figures/tables..	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Think Martini Glass and follow the scientific paper structure. • Supported by a well-designed Table of Contents. • Use your central theme(s) as your narrative arc that connects the various sections of the paper.
