WEEK OF APRIL 24: MANAGE YOUR TIME LIKE A PRO!

There is A LOT to do this week as you wrap up your classes and prepare for final exams. Try to remember that you have power over your time. A few tips for you:

- Look at the calendar for the next 10-14 days. Add classes, student orgs, and anything else that requires physical attendance. Now identify unstructured time and plan how you will use each block in 20 minute increments.
- Put your phone in airplane mode during times you want to be productive.
- Build in 15-20 minute breaks every 90-120 minutes. Stick to that time by setting an alarm on your watch!
- Consider using break time to change locations between study blocks. This helps your brain and body reset and prepare for the next thing on your to-do list.
- Mix up group study time and individual study time for maximum productivity.
- Get enough sleep! Research shows that this is incredibly important for efficiency and clarity during working hours.
- Try your hardest to stay on a schedule and prioritize your tasks. You can do this!!

Fall Break is almost here. And it is meant to be just that: A BREAK! Whether you are traveling or staying around campus, consider the following ideas while you're away from the classroom:

- <u>Sleep</u> (try going to bed early; it makes a difference!)
- You are about halfway through the semester, which is an awesome time for reflection. What has gone well so far and what has felt hard? This weekend will be a great time to think about changes to your approach, goals for the second half, and make plans for how you will reach them. But...how?
 - Get out your calendar, your syllabi, and fill in what will be required of you in courses between now and finals.
 - Thinking about a summer opportunity? Make an appointment with a career advisor via Handshake, where you can develop action steps together.
 - How will you remain balanced? Is there a WHAM class you can sign up for?
 Make an appointment with a counselor? Develop a workout schedule? Set a go-to sleep alarm? Think about what will work for you and work it into your schedule!
 - Connect with people in your community of support. This will likely fill up your heart.
 - Catch up on readings & assignments and maybe even try to get ahead. This
 will help with your overall wellness and help you feel in control of your
 schedule.

Most of all, enjoy your break; you have earned it!!

WEEK OF OCTOBER 10: HOW TO PREP FOR YOUR UPCOMING INTERVIEW!

Interviews may be on your schedule in the upcoming weeks. How best to prepare for them? See below.

The hiring manager likely gave you some details about the interview. Read through them carefully to look for the following information:

- O How long will it be?
- O Who will be present?
- o Is it online or in person?
- Is it behavioral in nature? Or will there be technical/case study questions asked?

Liz's tips for behavioral interviews:

- 1. Rather than thinking about potential answers to every question you can find online, think about 3-4 experiences you have had that are easy for you to talk about.
 - A project in one of your courses?
 - An internship experience?
 - Planning an event for your student org?
 - Think about examples that highlight teamwork, leadership, creativity, managing competing priorities, navigating roadblocks, and other big ideas
- 2. Use the STAR technique to structure your answers
- 3. Prepare to be asked the following questions!
 - Tell me about yourself/walk me through your resume
 - Why do you want to work here?
 - Do you have any questions for us? (prepare 3-5 of these in advance!--what do you want to know?)
