Student leaders worked tirelessly at the pancake breakfast, clearing tables and sorting compostable items, recyclables and dishware. The communit was very generous in their support of fundraising.

On December 14th, Pemberton Secondary School (PSS) had their first dance in many years and this event was a huge success. The PSS Leadership class decorated the Commons with a beautiful winter theme, organized a bake sale, and hired a professional DJ. Student/Staff Presentation

Last year, the Board approved Farm Studies, a new Board/Authority Authorized course, at Howe Sound Secondary. School Calendar Survey
