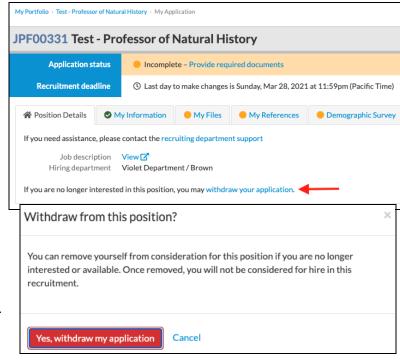
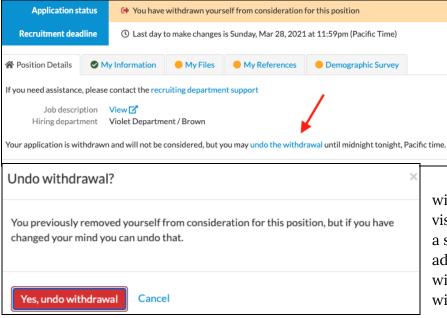
Recruit Release Notes Changes Launching 2020-10-01

Applicant Self-Withdrawal

We've started the Applicant Self-withdrawal project. When the feature becomes enabled, the applicants will be provided with the ability to withdraw from their **application**. A link will be available on the "Position Details" tab so the applicant can select to withdraw their application. If the applicant withdraws from a recruitment, they will not be visible to the committee members and their status will change to "withdrawn before..." or "withdrawn after..." depending on where they are at in the application process. After clicking on the withdrawal link, a pop up window will appear with text clearly indicating that they are removing themselves from consideration.





If the applicant decides to undo the withdrawal, they can do so and it will revert them back to the status they had prior to the applicant-initiated withdrawal.

They will have until midnight (Pacific time) to undo this action. Once it passes it cannot be undone by the applicant. The

withdrawal link will no longer be visible to the applicant if they reach a soft offer status or higher. In addition, any applicants that were withdrawn manually by an analyst will not see the undo link.

Bugs & stuff

- Resolved an issue with the requirement dot on the description field. It will now appear or disappear when a title code is selected without requiring a page refresh.
- Fixed an issue that occurred when the file name path was too long for Bulk download.
- Updated the Grant Information modal for waivers to include the Category header and text so it is consistent with the Category modal.
- Resolved a 406 error that occurred when an analyst attempted to change an applicant's email address to a pre-existing applicant's email address. Now a message will appear indicating either "already used for this recruitment" or "already used by another portfolio".
- We added a link to the "Learn more about your unit's AA goals" for the Affirmative action goals section for UCR.
