Time is Running out to Receive Bus Transportation Next School Year

Families whose children are eligible for bus transportation must register through HCPSS Connect Synergy to receive bus service for the 2023-2024 school year.

We don't want any students who qualify for transportation to be without a bus if they rely on that to get to and from school. Please contact the school if you need help registering your child. Please contact the HCPSS Office of Transportation at transportation@hcpss.org or 410-313-6732 if you have questions related to your eligibility to receive bus service. Families who reside in non-transportation areas are not eligible for bus transportation and do not need to take any action. Find the new [non-transportation areas for your school online](#). Students who receive transportation as part of their Individualized Education Program (IEP) or 504 Plan do not need to register.

FROM THE HEALTH ROOM

Attention **rising 7th graders** for the upcoming 2023-2024 school year; the Maryland State Department of Health and Mental Hygiene requires all 7th graders in the state of Maryland have one Tdap and one Meningitis (MCV4) vaccine BEFORE entering school.

Current 6th grade students who haven't received these vaccinations should have received a letter and consent form about the HCMS Vaccine Clinic being held on May 16th by the Howard County Health Department, where your child can receive those vaccines here at school- **FREE**.

If you want your child to receive the necessary vaccines at school, please return the signed consent form to the health room ASAP.

Your child may not be able to attend school this Fall until these vaccines are complete and the health room has a copy on file.
