THIS WEEK'S MOWING

Due to a family emergency in California, our regular mow team was unable to mow on Friday and Saturday. They have not yet returned. Due to the labor shortage, our landscape company is having problems recruiting a team to fill in. As soon as we have more information, we will pass it along. We are scheduled for weed control and fertilizer on Wednesday, August 24.

DROUGHT AND WATER NEEDS

The state of Utah continues in a severe drought. We have been asked to **reduce our water use** by 15 to 25 percent. There are several ways each of us can help:

- Run full loads in your dish and clothes washers
- Take shorter showers
- Flush your **toilets** judiciously
- When using the bathroom or kitchen sink, run the water only when needed
- Experiment with your lawn watering timer for optimum coverage
- Water when the wind is calm and the sun is down.

Water Pro, which provides water for our **common area lawns, will be shutting down the irrigation water in early September,** about a month earlier than usual, due to low levels in Utah Lake. However, your individual culinary system will keep your water coming. Details on the watering restrictions to follow.
