Unit 1: Early American Literature (Native American Literature)

Week 5: September 8-12, 2025



This week we'll be finalizing our study of Early American literature with Native American origin stories and creation myths. Students will be issued their textbooks and will complete a close-read of "The Earth on Turtle's Back," while also reading the contemporary piece Saints at the River. Students will identify Native American literary elements and annotate the text using different representative colors. We will continue to review vocabulary words, Level G, Unit 2, and a new individualized grammar lesson will be assigned in Quill (Quill #3). Later, this week, students will work on pre-writing strategies for their first essay and test preparation/review for the Unit 1 test on A-Wed 9/17 and B-Thurs 9/18.

Learning Objectives:

- Use resources found within the online textbook effectively (hmhco.com). *access through Google Classroom
- Demonstrate an understanding of the conventions of standard English grammar and mechanics (Quill #3).
- Identify argument elements (claims, reasons, evidence, warrants, counter-claims) within the article "Voices
 of Power."
- Make personal connections between Native American origin stories and students' own experiences (creation of "I Am From" personal origin poem).
- Trace the development of American literature from Native American origin stories to modern-day American
 fiction (*modern stories, <u>Firekeeper's Daughter</u> by Angeline Boulley, *The Way to Rainy Mountain* by N. Scott
 Momaday, selected creation stories, and <u>Saints at the River</u> by Ron Rash)
- Identify and Analyze literary elements reflective of Native American literature, specifically the characteristics of oral traditions (origin stories and myths).
- Define Level G, Unit 2 vocabulary words in context and identify synonyms and antonyms for these words.
