

HOW TO INCREASE YOUR BLOC'S INFLUENCE

Start Early

- Form your bloc early, during the first part of speeches off of the Secondary Speaker's list, send notes to delegates that seem to have good ideas that agree with your own country's ideas to start forming your bloc.
- Encourage all delegates to give feedback on your bundle of ideas so it can be the best possible version to present before the committee eventually. This also makes delegates more likely to vote for your bloc's motion.

Advocate for your bloc

- Speak during the Secondary Speaker's list to encourage discussion on the solutions your bloc has come up with. Encourage others in your bloc to do the same.
- Motion for moderated caucuses on subject's that are central to your bloc, this helps people better understand the ideas you are presenting. Also, the Dais will usually not allow a bloc to introduce their working paper until all the ideas in it have been discussed in committee, so it is in your best interest to discuss ideas you present.

Reach out

- Reach out during unmoderated caucuses or through notes to less vocal delegates, ask them for their thoughts, not only will these interactions help you understand what delegates might oppose in your working paper and how many will oppose it, they also help you continue to better the content of your working paper.
