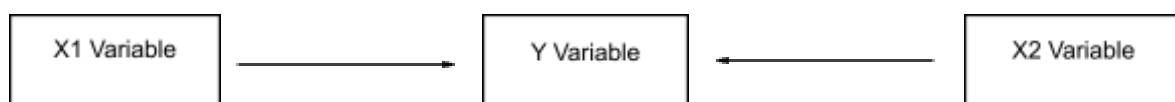


Figure 1: Conceptual Framework
