The summer work will not be graded on correctness, but on completion, and summer work will be graded. If a student does not complete the assignment, a zero (NHI) grade will be assigned, and the assignment cannot be redone.

English Summer Reading Assignment


Choose a book (a regular book or a graphic novel) that is appropriate for your current grade level during the 2025-2026 school year. After choosing your book, complete the assignment as you read it. Write journal entries as you read the book. In your journal entries, discuss what you believe the text means, cite evidence from the text to support your beliefs, and provide your thoughts and reactions. It is the student/guardian's responsibility to acquire a book. Talk to your English teacher BEFORE the summer break begins if you need help getting your book.

How to complete the Summer Reading Journal: Summer Reading Journal 2025

To make a 100, in all ten journal entries, you must explain what you think the selected text means, provide evidence from the text to support your belief, and provide your reaction to the text. Each individual entry should be AT LEAST one paragraph. Ensure that you list the pages where the entry can be found every time you make an e



ntry.

Please be sure your completed assignment is in one document, and you will upload the shared link by 8:00 am on the due date (**first day of school – Thursday, July 31st, 2025**). You may also do this on paper, but you are responsible for printing the journal entries. Please check your grammar, spelling, and punctuation (language conventions) before submitting the assignment.

This assignment is not meant to take away from your summer vacation, but please make sure you do not wait until the last minute to begin the assignment. The best way to complete it would be to read it gradually over the entire summer, reading one section at a time. Overall, it will prepare you for the type of task that will be required of you throughout the next school year.
