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INTRODUCTION

The introduction should be clear and provide for the issue to be discussed in the manuscript. Before the objective, authors should provide an adequate background, and very short literature survey in order to record the existing conditions, to show which is the best of previous researches, to show the main limitation of the previous researches, to show what you want to achieve (to solve the limitation), and to show the scientific merit or novelties of the paper. At the end of the paragraph, the author/s should end with a comment on the significance concerning identification of the issue and objective of the research.

This section is supported by a literature review which is used to support the research concept. Authors are required to present a literature review that is primary (references to journal articles and conference proceedings) and up-to-date (references published within the last 10 years). Literature review is

not limited to theory, but also empirical evidence. Enrich this introductory part with efforts that have been made by other parties.

HYPOTHESES DEVELOPMENT

In hypothesis development, the author is expected to explain how the hypothesis is formed based on concepts from previous research and theory. It is crucial to use the latest research results so that the hypothesis formed can close the research gap presented in the introduction. Furthermore, the conceptual framework is developed with an explanation.

RESEARCH METHODS

This method is written in descriptive and should provide a statement regarding the methodology of the research. This method is as much as possible give an idea to the reader.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

This section is the most important section of your article. The analysis or results of the research should clear and concise. The results should summarize (scientific) findings rather than providing data in great detail. Please highlight differences between your results or findings and the previous publications by other researchers. For tables you need to sound the table.

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Following main heading it should be provided for the manuscript. The separation between main headings, sub-headings and sub-sub headings should be numbered in the manuscript with following example:

Do not repeat the Abstract or simply describe the results of the research. Give a clear explanation regarding the possible application and/or suggestions related to the research findings.
