FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**



Good morning students and families,

As we approach our Final Exams tomorrow, it is important to remember that this can be a stressful time for students, especially our younger students that have not had exams prior to this.

To help with some of that anxiety, we have put together a list of some of the most common questions this week:

Do I have to go to my study hall or lunch?

Attendance will not be taken during study halls or lunches. If a student wants to attend, they will go to their study hall room or the cafeteria.

If I have a lunch or study hall at the beginning or end of the day, can I come in late or leave early?

Yes. We ask that you come as close as possible to the start of the next Final Exam. For example, if you have a 1st hour study hall and plan on staying home, please arrive as close to 9:10 as possible. Which is when the next final begins. If a student arrives earlier they will be required to wait in the main office or study hall room in order to keep the hallways quiet during testing.

Will the buses still run?

Yes. Some of the bus routes will be doubled up on the upcoming days. If a student needs a bus who typically doesn't take one, they may ride as well.

Is lunch served at the building?

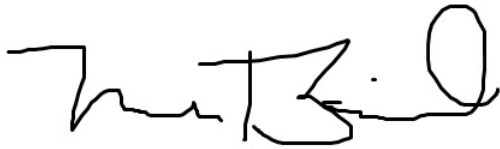
No. During lunch periods, students will sit in the cafeteria and use it as a study hall.

How long are the exams?

Each exam period is 65 minutes. Passing periods are extended to 10 minutes to give students some additional time to unwind before the next exam begins.
