Unit 1: Spanish 1 Review (Héctor-novel) 🛢 Spanish 1 all year vocab

Spanish 2 Honors builds upon the foundational 450 high-frequency words from Spanish 1 and expands students' vocabulary, grammatical range, and cultural understanding. Students will review the vocabulary learned during Spanish 1 in the first 24 days of school before we introduce the new vocabulary for Spanish 2.

Unit 2: ¿Eres tú María?

Students will improve listening comprehension, vocabulary, and cultural understanding through the first episode of ¿Eres tú, María?. They will be able to identify key characters, follow basic plot points, and practice conversational Spanish.

By the end of this unit, students can:

• Identify and describe main characters in a video in Spanish.

- Understand basic facts and events from an authentic Spanish video. Make predictions and inferences using evidence from a video. Write a short descriptive paragraph about a character or event. Ask and answer questions about the episode.
