

## Academic Course Plans for Rising 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> Grade Students (Class of 2025 - 2029)

~All students must pass Health and PE; this is taken as a ninth grader. Class of 2029 and after must complete an Arts Credit.

~Honors and AP class placement are suggested based on teacher recommendation and student grades in prerequisite courses.

~Students must meet graduation requirements (see that document) & have 28 credits to graduate; each class equates to one credit.

~Students may graduate with a 22 credit option if declared at the start of high school - students/parents should speak to counselor

~Students rarely take ALL CP or ALL Hon courses, but rather students challenge themselves in subject areas where they are strongest.
