Individual Education Plans (IEPs), Accommodations and more!

Question	Answer
How does my child qualify for an IEP?	Student's IEPs are created when documentation to support a learning need is submitted. The Learning Support Teacher (LST) will then draft an IEP for you and the student to review. <u>Individual Education Plan (IEP) Parent Guide</u>
How do I add or change accommodations on an IEP?	An IEP is a living document and can be changed at any time during the year, providing that the request is supported by documentation. If a parent/guardian requests a review, the LST can review documentation to decide if the request is appropriate.
Does my IEP carry forward to post-secondary?	No. Accommodations are granted at a postsecondary level based on supporting documentation (for example, a psycho-educational assessment). This testing has to have been completed within the past 5 years to be considered valid.
My child has duplicate notes on their IEP. How does this work?	Every class is different. Some teachers provide duplicate notes in the form of slides while others have SMART board printouts. Sometimes another student in the class, who takes excellent notes, is asked to photocopy their notes (Free photocopying in room 3201!).
My child has a memory aid listed as an accommodation on their IEP. What is that exactly?	Great question. Memory aids are NOT cheat sheets. Students who have this accommodation are to create their memory aid <u>at least</u> a day before the test and have it approved by their classroom teacher (signed).
