John Spencer Phillips is the child to:

8. Phillip Phillips/Philip Philips/Philip Phillips (You will find his name spelled differently depending on the forms or sources)

- Born between 1774 and 1794 (depending on your sources).
- Emigrated from Scotland to New Jersey according to John R. Phillips pg 81 in the book [*John Roberts Phillips : an autobiography, genealogy, history of the Civil War and of a Tory of Alabama fighting for the Union, including parts of Tennessee, Georgia, North Carolina and Alabama*](#)
- A source on Ancestry suggests Philip Phillips was born 1774 in Monmouth, Hunterdon, NJ - could this be after he emigrated with his parents? Are there actual documents that say this? Would his parents have been able to get a birth certificate in the US for their

son? Could it be a different Philip Phillips? How did emigration/immigration work back then?

- The only real documentation and information that matches across the board (Ancestry, MyHeritage, and the book I've linked above) is Philip Phillips marriage to Susannah Spencer (possible full name: Caroline Susannah "Suki" Spencer) on February 02 1809.

 - You will see on these documents that an **Abner Phillips** is the bondsman. Both MyHeritage and Ancestry also suggest Abner Phillips as Philip Phillips father. However, there is ZERO information on him or his wife Elizabeth (Elizabeth's maiden name, birth and death dates and records, marriage records, etc).
- Philip Phillips died between Oct 1828 - Oct 1835.
- Susannah Spencer was born between 1778-1779 in either Virginia or Surry County, NC.
- Susannah Spencer died in 1860 at Hotel District, Surry County, NC.

Philip Phillips is the child to:

9. Abner Phillips and wife Elizabeth.
