



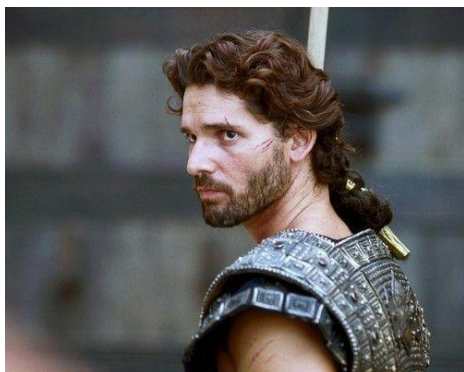
Achilles:

Who is he? Achilles is a greek demigod, who has a clear talent of fighting, outcompeting any man in his way, his mother sank him on a vessel with pure water to make him immortal, healing fast to any wound, but she hold him from the ankle, and that's why that is his weakness.

What did he feel like? Achilles went to war because of his pride, he wanted his name to be remembered for the upcoming centuries, he wanted to leave a mark, make his name truly remembered so he fought for his own self, not for any empire or kingdom.

What did he do well? What he did well was how he trained his cousin Patroclus with such devotion, and from the perspective of his side of the war he accomplished something tremendous, which was killing Hector. Also he saved Briseis on various occasions from the other greeks.

What did he do wrong? What was an awful act was once he murdered Hector he dragged his body through the sand all the way to his lair. That is an abhorrent act/justification: He was truly pissed about the death of his cousin caused by prince Hector.



Hector:

Who is he? Hector is the prince, heir to the throne of Troy and a remarkable warrior, he has a wife and a son.

What did he feel like? Hector is a man of upstanding moral,honor,pride,value,courage. He would protect his country and his people no matter what, he is a patriot who fights for his country no matter how difficult the war.

What did she do wrong? When she asked his husband Hector to stay before he went to war, and what's very bad about this is that Hector could remain with the feeling of guilt when fighting, not focusing with the right emphasis and precision/justification: She obviously didn't want her husband to maybe die in the fight, it is totally understandable from her point but she has to understand that her husband has a duty to protect her and the people in Troy.



Paris:

Who is he? Paris is the son of the king, the second prince of Troy, brother to Hector and the lover/boyfriend of Helen.

What did he feel like? Paris from what is shown in the movie only cares about love, loving Helen and getting the exact same in return, he admires his older brother deeply and he has the ego a little bit above and sometimes acts like a child.

What did he do well? From the perspective of Troy and her family he did something pretty difficult and very helpful which was killing Achilles. In the night invasion Achilles was with his cousin Briseis and Paris shot him with arrows, but he was lucky because he hit Achilles in the ankle which was his only weak point.

What did he do wrong? He did the most obnoxious and lame act in the whole movie for my taste and another tremendously stupid. What did he do wrong?
