MLB: Athletics vs Washington Nationals - 1 Unit (+115) - 12:05pm ET

Analysis:

After erupting for 16 runs and 24 hits on Tuesday night in D.C., the Athletics' bats cooled down on Wednesday, but they had been on a roll prior to that, winning five straight road games and consistently scoring in bunches. This offensive firepower suggests they have the ability to rebound quickly against Washington's pitcher Mitchell Parker, who has struggled recently. Parker's July ERA of 6.04 worsened last Friday when he was rocked for 8 runs across just 4 innings by the Brewers, and the Nationals' pitching staff as a whole has shown signs of vulnerability, having given up 54 runs over their last four games. Conversely, Jacob Lopez has provided a bright spot for the Athletics, recording two consecutive strong outings in which he allowed no runs over 9 1/3 innings, indicating he can deliver the quality starts needed to take advantage of Washington's pitching issues. All things considered, the combination of the A's potent offense, Lopez's recent performances, and Washington's pitching struggles create a favorable scenario for the Athletics to maintain their offensive momentum and possibly secure this matchup. **Public bets are favoring the A's at 80% and the money is coming in at 95% also favoring the A's.**

Marlins to win

Analysis:

Atlanta looks like they've flat-out mailed it in. Three straight losses and a season that's gone completely off the rails. Meanwhile, Miami has something to play for. They're clawing back to .500 and hanging around in the Wild Card race, and tonight's matchup gives them a real shot to keep the momentum going. The key edge here is on the mound. Eury Pérez has been a monster lately, rocking a 1.06 ERA over his last six starts, and on the season, he's holding a 2.70 ERA with a 0.94 WHIP, 26% strikeout rate, and barely giving up homers. On the flip side, Atlanta trots out Carlos Carrasco, who's way past his prime with a 5.68 ERA and basically serving as a body to eat innings for an injury-ravaged rotation. Offensively, Miami's hitting .260 on the road, while Atlanta is sputtering at .237 over their last 23 games. Their bullpen isn't helping either, with a 5.88 ERA in that stretch, compared to a much sharper 3.06 from Miami's pen. And when you look at trends, the Marlins are 21-18 on the road against NL teams hitting .255 or worse, good for a +14.9-unit return. Atlanta? They've lost 11 of their last 15 at home and are down over 11 units. This one sets up perfectly for Miami to capitalize. **Public bets are at 64% and 74% of the money both favoring the fish.**
