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Review of any new staff concerns submitted via the Google Form.

1. There is a concern about the perceptions surrounding hiring practices within the PPLC. Some staff feel that the process is not uniformly rigorous, with some members being hired through personal connections. This has led to newer hires feeling unqualified or undervalued, which can create a sense of inequality. Comments about how people were hired may contribute to this perception, making new staff feel unwelcome or discouraged.
2. There is a concern regarding the lack of an opportunity for staff to provide feedback on professional development that aligns with departmental focus areas and the skills students need for the ACT.
3. There is a concern regarding recent changes to the school's programming and course offerings, particularly the introduction of mandatory junior and senior seminars, as well as the Embarc program. These changes were not discussed with the ILT or PPLC prior to implementation, and there is uncertainty about how they align with the school's CIWP, vision, and mission, especially as a selective enrollment high school. Staff are concerned that the addition of these required courses will limit students' ability to take higher-level electives, particularly those that prepare them for college coursework. This could impact students' academic flexibility and their ability to pursue courses that align with their post-secondary goals. Additionally, there is a lack of data to support these decisions, and the new courses do not appear to match the course structures of other selective enrollment high schools, which do not require these types of seminars. Concerns have been raised that these changes may inadvertently hinder students' preparation for selective colleges by limiting their access to college-level electives and opportunities.
