Bosherton Lakes

The lakes at Bosherton lie near Bosherton village on the road to St Govan's, see map [here](#). They are surrounded by mature woodland and between the lakes and the coast there are sand dunes. A good selection of woodland birds can be seen from the paths around the lakes including Greater Spotted Woodpecker, Nuthatch, Treecreeper and Tits. On the lakes themselves a relatively small number of ducks occur including Tufted Duck, Gadwall and, in the winter, Goosander and Goldeneye. Good numbers of Mute Swan reside on the lakes with much display in early spring. In the nearby sand dunes and woodland Green Woodpecker occurs. Sightings of Otters are frequent.

The Bosherton Lakes are part of the National Trust's Stackpole Estate. Park Park either at the National Trust car park at Bosherton Church (map ref SR967948) or at Lodge Park bridge (map ref SR976964).
