

Anti-Match Quiz: Oscars 2022 Results

This document outlines the results of my Anti-Match Quiz run from February 11 to 25, 2022. It was inspired by the Best Picture nominees of that year. There were a frankly astonishing 362 competitors, smashing last year's record. Thanks so much to all of you who played. Special thanks to Nicole Kozdron, Jim Moskowitz, and Miranda Phair for their early feedback. (Since they took the quiz without references first, I kept their answers in the scoring.)

Belfast

According to worldpopulationreview dot com, Belfast is the 25th most populous city in the United Kingdom with 274,770 people in 2022. Name one of the 24 more populous cities.

Our first question shows one of the interesting aspects of this style of quiz. The most populous city by far in the United Kingdom scored lower than eight other correct responses. There were

several responses that no one gave, all of which were towards the bottom of the list. And we did have two singletons, i.e. a response that exactly one person gave, scoring them one point.

There were also several incorrect responses. Some were outside the UK, and a few were good guesses that came up short on population.

For each correct answer, I give the codes for all the people who gave that answer followed by the score for the answer in parentheses. Answers for this particular question are given in decreasing order of population with the population given.

CODA

The word “coda” in music refers to the concluding section of a work. It derives from the Italian word for “tail”. Give another term from music that is derived from a word in Italian. Words must have a definition in the Merriam Webster online dictionary that references music and comes from Italian in its etymology.

After scoring this, I feel like every word associated with music must come from Italian. OK, that's not true, but you all collectively came up with 81 different musical terms. Due to the large number of potential answers, scores were relatively low. There were a bunch of singletons, some of which were surprising.

I corrected for misspelling when I thought there was a clear intended answer. As mentioned above, I used merriam-webster.com to check for both definitions and etymology. There were a few plausible sounding answers that failed one of those checks.

Don't Look Up

Each of the letter/number combinations below corresponds to the name of a type of reference source, as based on the list provided by the Wayne State University library system. The letter is the first letter of the name, and the number is the length. For example, "W (4)" might correspond to "wiki". Note that these are all types of reference sources, not specific titles. Give the complete word corresponding to one of the combinations. All answers are in the singular. As a small help, the combinations are in alphabetical order of the full words. A (7) / A (5) / B (12) / B (9) / C (10) / D (10) / D (9) / E (12) / G (9) / H (8) / I (5) / M (6) / T (9) / T (8) / Y (8)

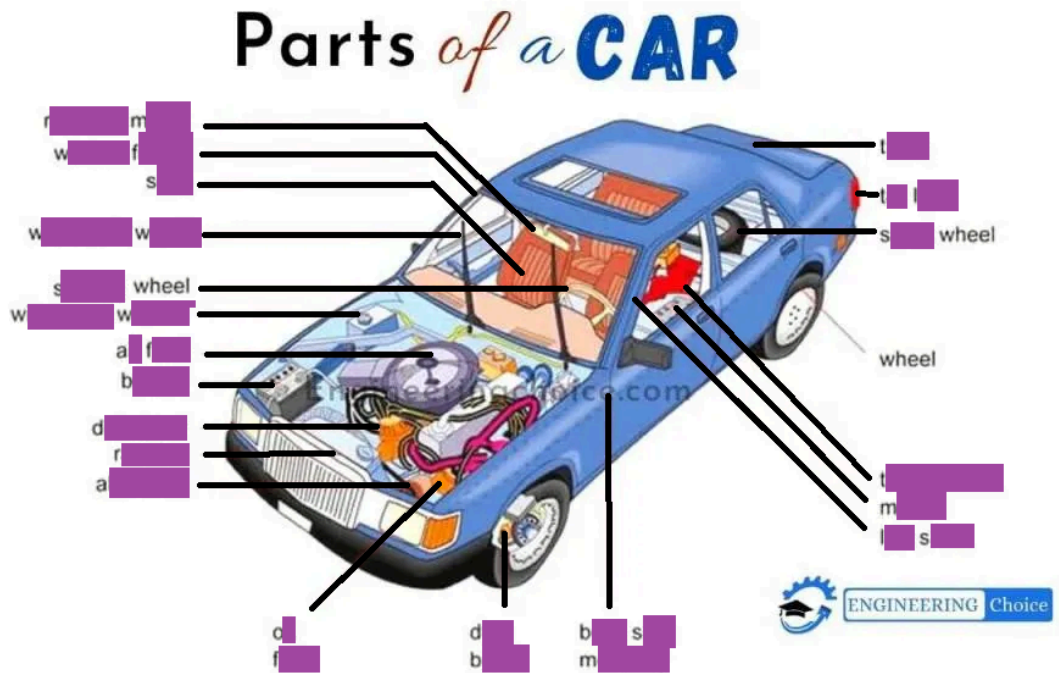

Dune

Give a 4-letter English word that can be formed by changing exactly one letter in the word DUNE to a different letter (without rearrangement; for example, UNDO is not an acceptable answer). Capitalized words are OK; you can ignore accent marks in your answer. Your answer must appear in the Merriam Webster online dictionary.

A search of the word matcher at quinapalus.com finds 29 possible answers for this question, of which 21 were found by all the participants and 5 were not in merriam-webster.com (including "duna" which was given). The three that were missed were duce (as in leader), Duse (an early 20th-century Italian actress) , and sune (archaic for soon). The highest scoring word was very appropriate.

King Richard

Stephen King sometimes wrote novels under the name of Richard Bachman. Give the title of a novel (not collection) published prior to the year 2000 attributed to either of these authors.

This question was the first to give me pause during scoring for two different reasons.

For books in the Dark Tower series, I accepted those which were just the subtitle of one of the books in the series. However, I did not accept "The Dark Tower". It's not clear which entry in the series that refers to, and the one whose title is "The Dark Tower VII: The Dark Tower" was published in 2004.

There were several titles given that were contained in other collections, like "Rita Hayworth and Shawshank Redemption" or "The Langoliers". These seem to be regarded as novellas rather than novels, and as they were not published as separate books originally, I decided not to count them as correct. "Cycle of the Werewolf" is also sometimes considered a novella, but as it

originally appeared in its own book (and is referred to in at least one edition as a “novel” on the cover), I decided to accept it.

In general, all possible correct answers were given with the exception of “The Dark Tower III: The Waste Lands”. I corrected for spelling and missing articles (so, for those whose answer was Pet Sematary, you’re welcome). With each title, I give the initials of the credited author and the year of publication.

This one was brutal. There were more different incorrect answers (38) than there were different correct answers (29). Some of those incorrect ones were very close to a correct answer, but were missing a keyword or added something not on the official name on the menu.
