Why should Stamford have legal VASA trails?

- ❖ Liability Insurance
- ❖ Local and VASA Trail Maintenance
- ❖ VASA pays for 50% of maintenance cost/ club pays 50%
- ❖ VASA memberships cover the cost of law enforcement
- ❖ Club sticker fee goes back to the local club

Other Information

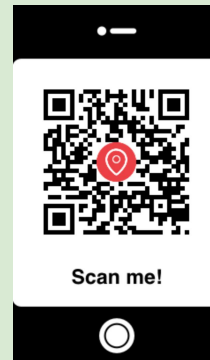
- ❖ Dirt Bikes can be given permission from the Select Board, to ride on roads or landowner permission. They will not be able to buy a VASA pass
