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WELCOME!

We are excited about this year's Bandys Trojan Band and the addition of our talented class of first-year marchers and the new freshmen class! With your participation, this is sure to be another great year for our program as we continue to maintain and expand the proud traditions and reputation of our band. We have lots of activities and performances planned for this year that are sure to make this a fantastic year in band!!

PHILOSOPHY

It is the philosophy of the Bandys Band program that the study of music is one of the most important parts of a student's complete and well-rounded education. We believe that students who study music do better in all parts of their education, and that they enter the adult world as more prepared and complete individuals. The band program seeks to foster this education by creating a family environment that involves patience, love, compassion, and understanding, as well as discipline, pride, commitment, and a strong work ethic. Mission:

- Provide students with an opportunity to learn about music that is both educational and enjoyable, through the study and performance of instrumental music.
- Instill and support student development of communication skills, critical thinking, problem solving, leadership, pride, cooperation, work ethic, and discipline.
- Create a place where individual and ensemble talents can flourish, and where students can create lasting relationships with others who share their love for music.

Goals:

- Develop each performer and ensemble to the best of their potential.
- Help each individual become the best person they can be through a consistent, family environment.
- Maintain a strong reputation of excellence for the band program that all members, directors, friends, and family-past, present, and future-can take pride in.

MEMBERSHIP

The Bandys Trojan Band program is made up of 9–12 grade students with at least two prior years of instrumental music study, or equivalent ability as determined by the band staff. Band is a four-year program, and while certain aspects of the curriculum are similar from year to year, it is important that a student is enrolled each semester to receive the maximum benefit. The physical skills and musical concepts built each semester can only be improved by

consistent, ongoing participation. For this reason, students must sign up for both semesters of band each year. If a student does not enroll in consecutive semesters, they may re-enter the program only by completing one semester of Concert Band upon return.

With careful planning and course selection, it is possible to complete four years in the band program, even with other academic requirements and electives. Many band students continue their involvement with music into college and beyond, and many receive music scholarships and awards for their efforts.

ENSEMBLES

Concert Band I and II:

Designed to create a smooth transition from middle school to high school band, this ensemble is mostly freshmen, plus upperclassmen who are joining color guard or learning new instruments. The course allows students time to adjust to the 90-minute high school schedule, the expectations and rigors of the Bandys program, and the level of playing proficiency required to perform advanced music. The ensemble is a low-stress environment designed to prepare students for the competitive and faster-paced environment of Marching/Symphonic Band. Festival performance is introduced, but the focus is on developing individual and ensemble music skills.

Marching Band:

The Marching Band meets first semester and is composed of all 9–12 grade band members and freshman color guard members. The ensemble performs an average of 20–25 times in the fall, including all home varsity football games, select away games, competitions, and holiday parades. Rehearsals begin with Summer Band Camp (last week of July/first week of August), followed by Tuesday and Thursday evening rehearsals until school starts. During the school year, rehearsals are held in class each day, with after-school rehearsals on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday (3–5 p.m.), dropping Monday rehearsals after September. Sectionals may be scheduled as needed. Attendance at all rehearsals and performances-including Band Camp-is required to ensure a spot in the field show. Conflicts should be communicated well in advance.

Symphonic Band:

This class meets second semester and is our indoor concert ensemble, open to all 9–12 grade band students. The band performs an average of five times during the semester and participates annually in the North Carolina Bandmasters State Concert Band Festival. Students may take band for honors credit, which requires proficiency in all-district scales and auditioning for All-County and All-District bands. The ensemble gives at least two concerts annually, with additional performances scheduled as needed.

Color Guard:

Auditions are held at the beginning of each season, and membership is based on performance. The group rehearses after school throughout the year. Guard uniforms are purchased by the student each season, determined by show design.

Equipment is assigned and must be properly maintained. Guard members are strongly encouraged to enroll in a music class during the spring semester. All returning members must re-audition each year.

BAND STAFF

All student members of the Bandys High School Marching Band are expected to treat every member of the band staff-including assistant directors, instructors, quest clinicians, and other designated adults-with the utmost respect and courtesy at all times. The band staff dedicates their time, expertise, and energy to support your musical and personal growth, and their instructions are essential for the success of the ensemble. Students should listen attentively, follow directions promptly, and maintain a positive and cooperative attitude during all interactions with staff. Talking or disruptive behavior while staff members are instructing is not acceptable, as it detracts from the learning environment and shows a lack of respect for their role. Insubordination or disregard for staff authority will not be tolerated and may result in disciplinary action, including removal from rehearsals or performance. Remember that the same standards of respect, attentiveness, and professionalism apply regardless of which staff member is leading rehearsal or instruction. By honoring the contributions of all staff, you help create a positive, productive, and supportive atmosphere for everyone in the band. Additional Band Staff include

GRADING POLICY

Each ensemble follows a similar grading policy. Students earn grades through participation in class and rehearsals, performances, and written/playing tests. Consistent practice at home is expected and is a key part of membership.

- Participation (50%): Daily involvement, punctuality, preparedness, rehearsal etiquette, and positive attitude. Each time expectations are not met, three points are deducted from the nine-weeks participation grade.
- Written/Playing Tests (25%): Includes written quizzes, marching fundamental quizzes, playing "pass-offs," and tests on theory, history,

- scales, and performance excerpts. Students are given prior notice for tests.
- Performance/Exam Grades (25%): Participation in performances, including being on time, having required materials, and proper etiquette. Excused absences require advance approval and a make-up assignment due the day of the missed performance.

Extra credit may be earned by returning signed progress reports and other materials promptly, as well as through other opportunities announced during the year.

ATTENDANCE AT PERFORMANCES

Attendance at all rehearsals and performances is mandatory for all ensembles. More than two excused absences or any unexcused absences may result suspension, or removal from the band. All conflicts must be approved by the band staff in advance. **Work is not considered an excused absence.**Emergencies will be considered individually and should be reported as soon as possible.

Participation in band is a commitment to others beyond ourselves. Absences hurt the entire ensemble. Band is a commitment to the group, and students are expected to keep that in mind.

REHEARSAL AND CLASSROOM RULES

- IF YOU DON'T NEED IT TO PLAY, DON'T BRING IT DOWN! Only instruments, music, pencils, and necessary materials are allowed in the rehearsal area.
- PRACTICE AT HOME, REHEARSE IN CLASS-KNOW THE DIFFERENCE!
 Prepare music at home; rehearsal time is for ensemble work.
- BE SUPERIOR IN REHEARSAL AS WELL AS PERFORMANCE. Arrive on time, prepared, focused, and disciplined.
- ACT AS AN INDIVIDUAL GROUP, NOT A GROUP OF INDIVIDUALS. Every member's actions affect the whole ensemble.
- SPEAK WITH ONE VOICE, OR DO NOT SPEAK. Only one person speaks at a time, whether it's the director, a classmate, or a guest.

PROGRAM GUIDELINES AND EXPECTATIONS BEYOND REHEARSAL

- Conduct yourself with pride, commitment, and dedication at all times.
- Punctuality is essential: "If you're early, you're on time; if you're on time, you're late; if you're late, you're in trouble!"
- Be patient with schedule changes; staff will communicate updates as soon as possible.

- Students must travel with the band to all events. To leave with someone else, a travel release form must be completed and signed out in person.
- All Bandys High School and Catawba County School Board policies apply during band activities.
- Students are responsible for the care and return of all issued equipment and uniforms. "You break it, you buy it!"
- Always travel with a "band buddy" during band activities-no exceptions.
- Any form of stealing, vandalism, insubordination, or disregard for policies may result in disciplinary action, including dismissal.

UNIFORMS

Uniforms are issued at the beginning of each performance season:

- Marching Band (Summer): Students purchase white or black tennis shoes, khaki shorts. black gloves, and a Bandys Band Shirt are provided. These last throughout the marching seasons.
- Marching Band (Fall/Winter): Full uniform (suspender pants, jacket, cape, gauntlets, helmet, plume) is issued and stored at school. Cleaning costs are included in the band camp fee. Students purchase PLAIN LONG BLACK SOCKS and marching shoes.
- Symphonic/Concert Band: Concert uniforms to be determined during the school year.
- Color Guard: All parts of the uniform must be purchased by the student each season, as determined by show design. Some items can be reused in future years.

SCHOOL-OWNED INSTRUMENTS

A limited number of school-owned instruments (mainly large or specialized) are available. Students must provide their own method books and materials (reeds, valve oil, etc.). There is no rental fee, but students are responsible for repair costs due to negligence. Instruments are assigned upon return of a signed usage agreement.

LEADERSHIP TEAM

Student leadership positions include Drum Major and Band Captains (Hornline, Woodwind, Percussion, Guard), selected by audition and training. Leaders are expected to:

- Provide instruction and assist with rehearsals and performances.
- Maintain discipline and support the band director and staff.
- Set an example in performance, rehearsal, and conduct.
- Coordinate conflict resolution and communicate with other leaders.

All members are expected to:

- Be respectful to peers, leadership, directors, and adults supporting the band.
- Show pride and discipline in all activities.
- Commit to excellence in academics, behavior, and musical growth.

BAND CAMP AND DRESS CODE

For all marching band camp sessions and rehearsals, students are required to wear comfortable athletic shoes, preferably tennis shoes-that provide proper support for extended periods of standing and movement. Clothing should be suitable for the weather conditions and must always adhere to the school's dress code.

For performances, hair must be contained in the marching band hat(shako). All jewelry must be removed.

To help protect against sun exposure during outdoor activities, students are strongly encouraged to bring and wear sunglasses and a hat or cap with a brim. These items will help shield their eyes and face from the sun's rays. Each student must bring their own refillable water bottle to stay hydrated throughout the day. Water coolers will be available on site for refills, but individual bottles are not provided.

Additionally, students are responsible for bringing their own sunscreen or sunblock, as the school is not permitted to supply any type of sun protection product due to health and safety regulations. Please ensure that your student applies sunscreen before arriving and brings extra to reapply as needed during the day.

BAND BOOSTERS ORGANIZATION

The Bandys band program is supported by an active parent organization that provides physical, financial, and moral support. All parents are encouraged to participate. Meetings are usually on the first Tuesday of each month. Boosters assist with chaperoning, building props, sewing, maintaining vehicles, cheering on students, and-most importantly-fundraising.

The marching band fee for 2025–2026 is \$350, due by August 8, 2024. Contact Mrs. Horner if payment arrangements are needed.

School-Owned Instrument Agreement

Dear Parents and Students,

We are pleased to provide your child with a school-owned instrument for use in band this year. Many students have volunteered to play these instruments to help balance our band's instrumentation, and we appreciate their flexibility and commitment.

Please note the following guidelines regarding school-owned instruments:

- Supplies: Students are responsible for providing their own accessories, such as reeds, valve oil, cork grease, and method books. These items are not included with the instrument, but may be purchased at a reduced price through the school. If you need assistance obtaining these materials, please let us know and we will do our best to help.
- Rental Fees: There is no rental fee or up-front cost for using a school-owned instrument, thanks to the support of our band boosters. Unlike many programs, we are proud to offer this opportunity free of charge.
- Care and Repairs: All instruments have been inspected and repaired over the summer and are in good playing condition. The band program will cover the cost of normal maintenance and wear-and-tear repairs. However, families will be responsible for any repair costs resulting from negligence or accidental damage caused by the student. Please help us ensure these instruments are well cared for so they remain available for future students.
