## **Tips to Improve Reading Comprehension**

- Do the course readings. Many of your classes, regardless of subject, will give you the opportunity to read articles, book chapters, etc. and discuss it or write about it later.
- Engage with the text. Ask yourself questions about what you just read, look up words you don't understand, and think of what might come next in the text.
- *Read in your spare time.* Short stories, novels, magazine articles, academic/research journals, anything! Read a variety of material, in subjects you normally wouldn't consider. Just like anything else, reading is a skill that can be improved. The more you practice reading, the faster you read, and the better reader you become!
