The team continued on to the farm, and seeing the empty wagon the husband and father thought the team had run away, and at once started out and found the missing ones. The woman was in such seoudition all night that she could not explain the affair until Tuesday morning, when the bashourt hastened to Spokune Falls and informed the officers. Both the mother and child will recover from the injuries received. As soon as notified the officers started out on the trail of the Indiane. On Thursday heet, the Indian, or what Sheriff Dillon supposed to be the Indian, was found. was taken before the lade who manediately recognized him as being the one who assaulted her. He was brought to this cir, lodged in juil and was awaiting trial, when the neck-tie party of last Ja Sanday evening ended the career of Mr. Indian. While we do not think that lynching is just the proper thing among law-abiding people, we believe that this man ucacaved at he gos.
