Leon Levine Hall of Health Sciences (LLHS) FAQs

BEAVER COLLEGE OF HEALTH SCIENCES

Q. When is LLHS open?

A. During the fall and spring semesters, LLHS is open Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. when classes are in session. During the summer sessions, LLHS is open Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. when classes are in session. When the University is open but classes are not in session, the building is open Monday through Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. When the University is closed and on the weekends, the building will be closed to students and other visitors.

Q. Are building tours available?

A. Self-guided tours are available when the building is open, and we invite you to stop by for a self-guided tour using the information found at the Welcome Desk in the atrium. There are also guided tours during the fall and spring semesters, and you can sign up for these using the online request form.

If you are interested in learning more about one or more of our Beaver College of Health Sciences programs rather than attending a general building tour, please contact the <u>program of interest</u> directly to set up an appointment.

If you are interested in visiting the main campus, please sign up for a tour through Undergraduate Admissions or the Graduate School.

Q. What departments/programs are located in LLHS?

A. Six of the seven departments in the Beaver College of Health Sciences are housed in Levine Hall. The Department of Recreation Management and Physical Education (RMPE) is located on campus in the Holmes Convocation Center.

Q. Are all Beaver College of Health Sciences' classes taught at LLHS?

A. No. RMPE courses remain on campus or at other appropriate off-campus sites. Some introductory, general education and non-major courses from the other five departments are also taught in the Holmes Convocation Center.

Q. What if I have back-to-back classes at LLHS and on main campus? Do I have enough time to travel back and forth between classes?

A. The classes at LLHS are offset by 30 minutes from classes scheduled on main campus. This allows students enough time to travel between the different locations, but students are responsible for setting their schedules accordingly. We suggest <u>a minimum of 45 minutes</u> between classes in different locations.

Q. Where should I go for Advising if I am majoring in a program in the Beaver College of Health Sciences?

A. The majority of Beaver College of Health Sciences advisors have offices in LLHS. However, we also maintain some advising offices in Holmes Convocation Center to accommodate students on the main campus, including advising for RMPE and Health Professions students. Please check with <u>your advisor</u> to determine the appropriate appointment location, and note that some advisors hold appointments in both Holmes and LLHS.

Q. I am a pre-health professions student. Where should I go for advising?

A. Health Professions Advising will be available in both LLHS and the Holmes Convocation Center. Please contact the HPA Office to determine the appropriate appointment location.

Q. Where can I find my instructor's offices?

A. All faculty offices, with the exception of RMPE faculty, are located in LLHS on the fourth and fifth floors. There are electronic building directories at the two main entrances to LLHS with additional information.

Q. Where can students park near LLHS?

A. Students have the opportunity to purchase parking permits from <u>Appalachian State Parking and Transportation</u> from the State Farm Student Parking Lot near LLHS. This lot costs approximately \$408 per academic year and is located approximately 0.6 miles from LLHS. Students can either take the pedestrian/bike path (12-15 minute walk) or ride on the Wellness District Shuttle (arrives every 20 minutes). Similar to other student parking on campus, students may only park in the lot associated with their parking pass.

The Faculty/Staff Parking Lot behind the building is available to students after 5:00 p.m., except for the parking spaces that are reserved 24/7.

Parking permits can be purchased through <u>Parking & Transportation</u>. Students can typically register for parking passes beginning in mid-July, and the purchase date is based on how many credit hours you have earned. We **strongly** encourage you to purchase a parking permit. Students who utilize these parking spaces have had less difficulty getting to their classes on time. We understand that some town lots / local businesses have begun towing and ticketing vehicles. In addition, we want to be good neighbors and support our area businesses.

Q. Are there buses that stop at LLHS and at parking lots?

A. There are four bus lines that stop at LLHS:

- 1. The <u>Wellness District Shuttle</u> arrives at LLHS every 20 minutes as described above and travels between LLHS and the State Farm Parking Lot, with several other stops.
- 2. The AppalCart Express bus arrives at LLHS approximately every 30 minutes and travels between LLHS and campus (Peacock). Note that it stops at the bottom of University Hall Drive on the way to campus.
- 3. The AppalCart <u>Pink Line</u> arrives at LLHS approximately every 10-20 minutes and travels from LLHS to University Hall Drive, and then on to campus (Peacock). Note that there are no buses that travel from University Hall Drive to LLHS without first traveling back through campus / Peacock Circle.
- 4. The AppalCart Red Line arrives at LLHS approximately every 15 minutes and travels between LLHS and campus (Library).

The ETA Spot App (https://www.appalcart.com/live-transit) will show real-time data, and when and where the next bus will arrive near you.

Q. Is there food available in LLHS?

A. There are food and drink machines and a microwave available in the vending area on the first floor. Rise Cafe also provides a variety of options from App State Campus Dining.

The *Everyone Eats* Food Pantry is available for students, faculty, and staff in Room 542G whenever LLHS is open. The Pantry stocks food items, toiletries, books, and professional clothing.

Q. Is there a place for students to print in LLHS?

A. Students may print in the Computer Lab (room 250). If the Lab is being used by a class, students may also print at the print station located in the West hallway around the corner from the Computer Lab.

Q. How do I reserve a locker in LLHS?

A. Students, faculty, and staff may reserve a locker for one semester in LLHS by simply locating an empty locker in the building and providing their own lock for it.

Q. Can I reserve a room in LLHS?

A. Faculty and staff in the Beaver College of Health Sciences may request to reserve a room by completing the room request form linked from our <u>website</u>. Reservations may be made for a particular semester once the class schedule is finalized and students begin registering for classes. Reservation requests are also open to Appalachian State University faculty, staff, and students outside of the Beaver College of Health Sciences for university and education-related meetings and events.

Note that five small group rooms (221, 227, 229, 252, and 254) are available for immediate "express scheduling" for 2 hours or less by any App State faculty member, staff member, or student. These rooms have a sign with a QR code for instant scheduling.

Q. What other services and specialized areas are available in LLHS?

A. On the 5th floor of LLHS, you can find: (a) the *Everyone Eats* Food Pantry (542G), which stocks food items, toiletries, books, and professional clothing; (b) a Meditation / Relaxation Room (542H), a quiet, comfortable place designed for meditation and relaxation; and (c) a Mother's Lounge (542J), which features a changing table, refrigerator, gliding chair, and mirror. These areas are available whenever the building is open.
